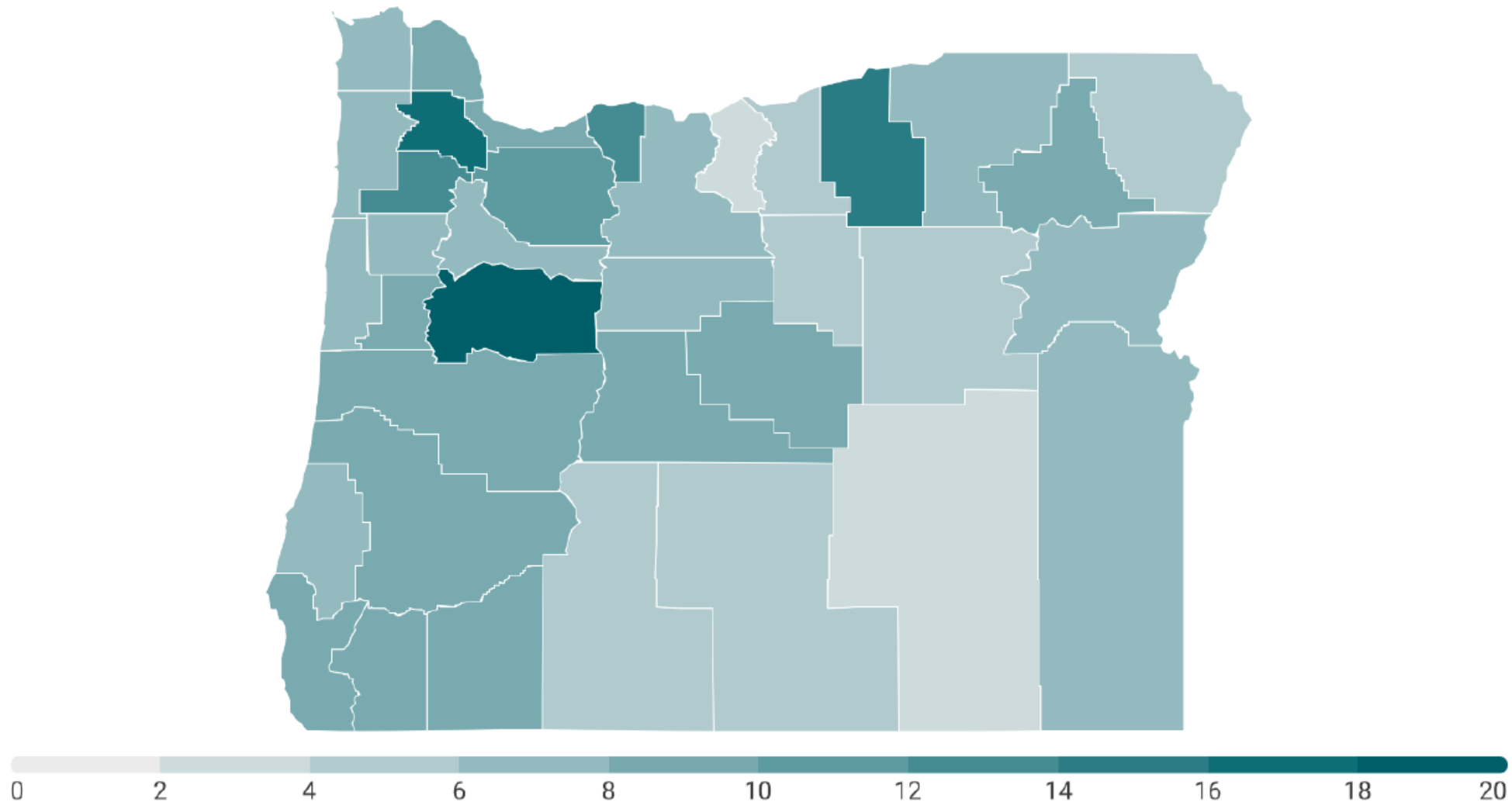
Oregon Global Trade

- Oregon is one of 11 states with a trade surplus
- In 2022, Oregon exported \$42B in goods and services
- In 2022, 88% of goods exporters were small or mid-sized companies
- 1 in 8 jobs is supported by global trade
- In 2024, 11% of the state's GDP is from trade

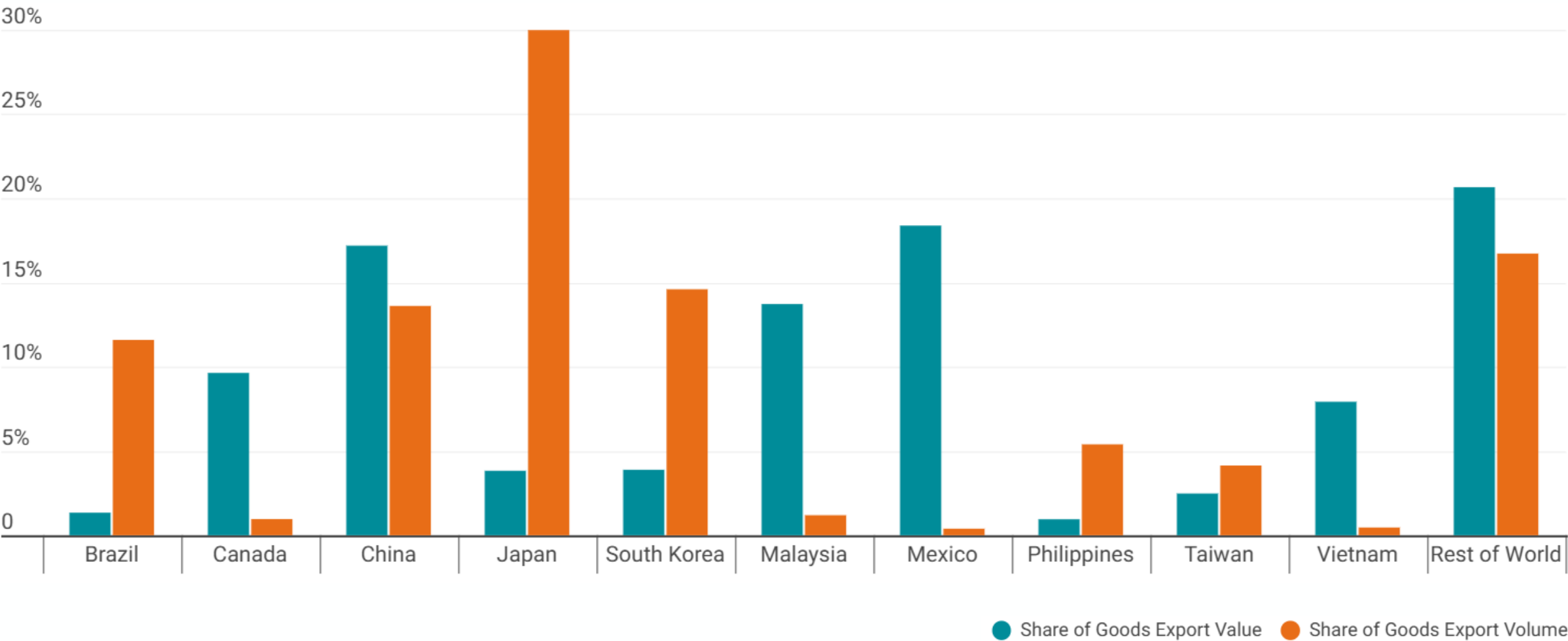
International trade supports jobs across the state

2024 Oregon Exports

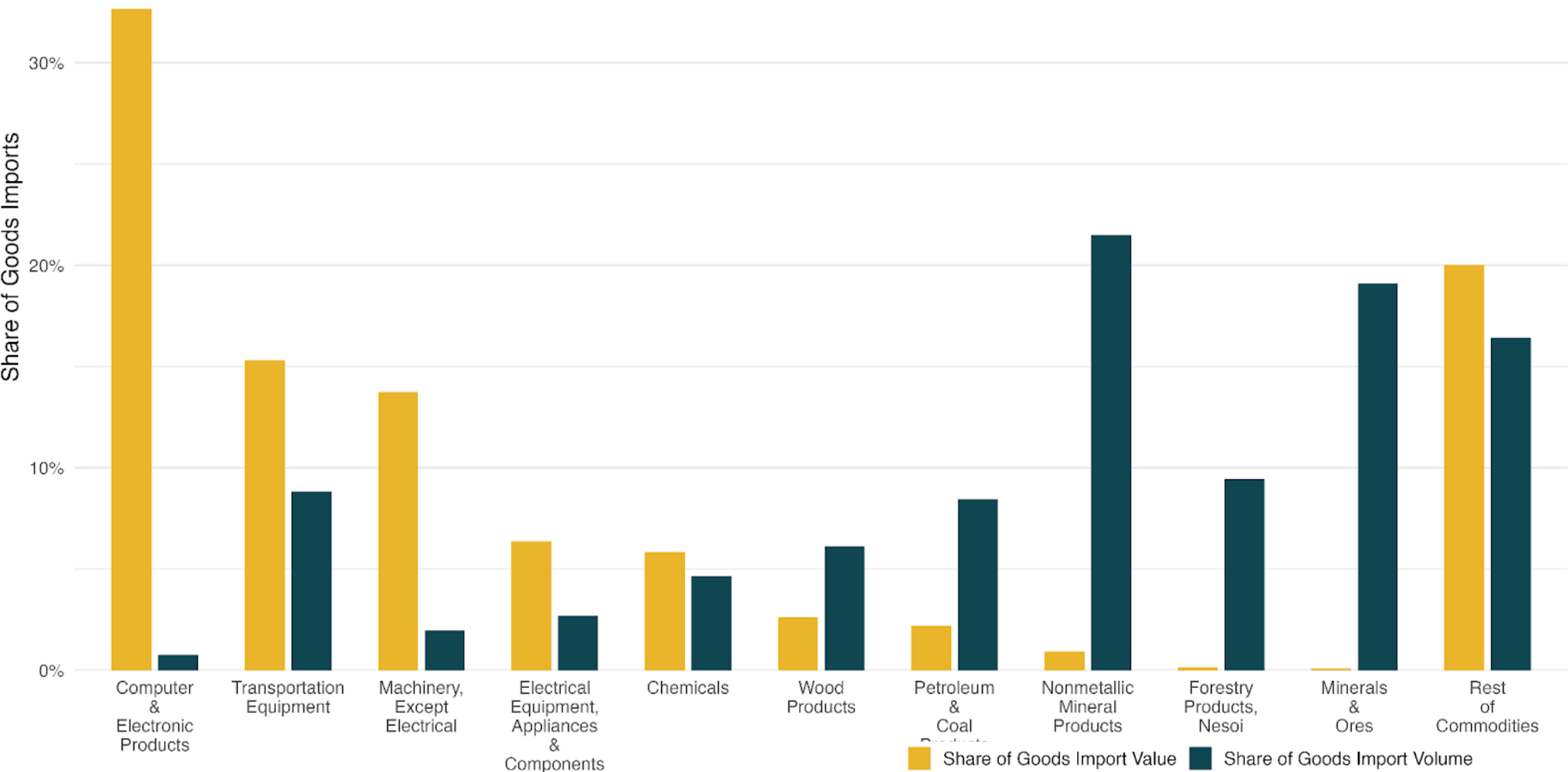
Oregon exports include both high-value and high-volume goods

2024 Oregon Imports

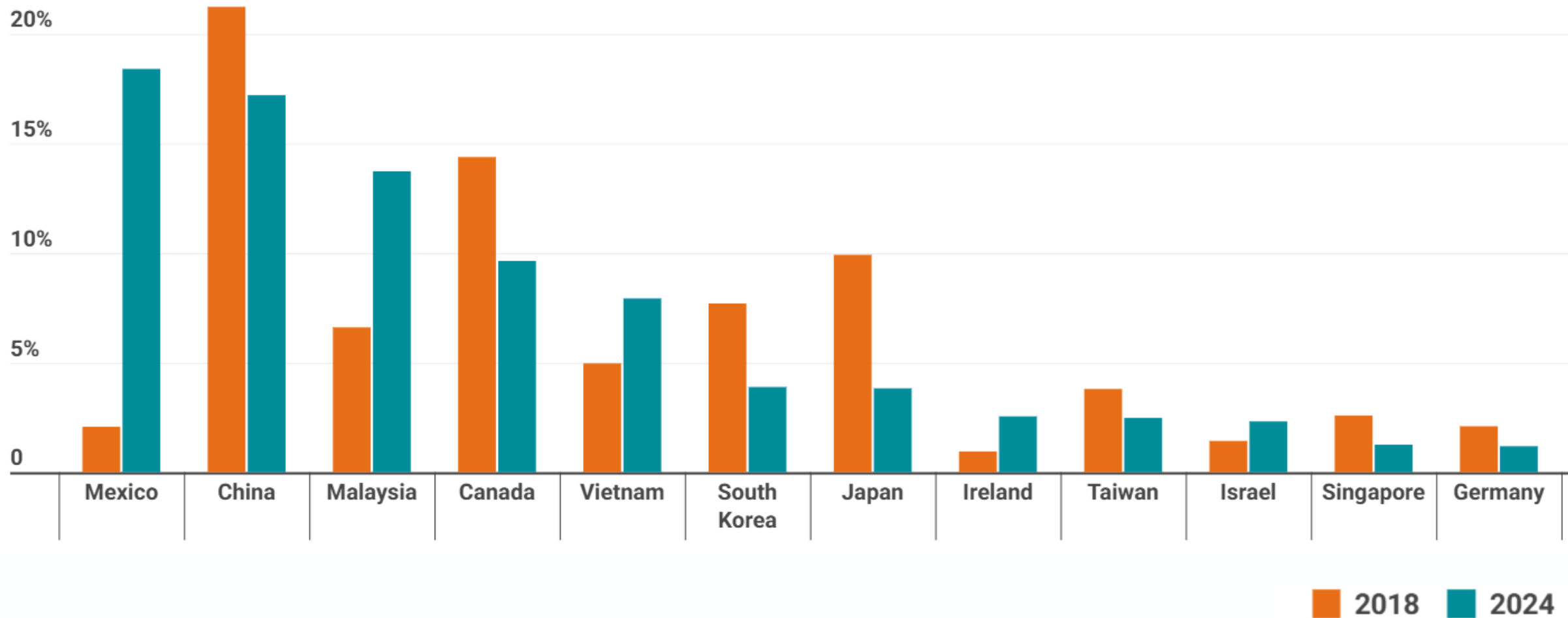
Businesses of all sizes and consumers depend on imports
