The Transportation bill, if passed, will negatively affect the lives of many Seniors in rural areas like Tillamook County, and add a large ridership burden to out already inadequate public transportation system. The combined new taxes will have many (Seniors especially) giving up their cars due to financial strains and in doing so, lose their independence. Public bus transportation is extremely limited in Tillamook County, not coming within a mile of my home. Taxi service is not available. My only public option would be the very limited option of Dial-a-Ride which is already insufficient for our local needs.

Locally, as folks decide to drive less to save money our local economy will suffer due to loss sales, being replaced by Amazon deliveries and such, or just less consumer spending in general. These taxes will have a bad ripple affect locally.

And for the state, when folks start giving up their vehicles state revenue will drop accordingly... so you really will not have accomplished anything, except less vehicles from which to collect.
