Dear Members of the committee,

I echo many: this special session is not needed and uncalled for. Many have already shown this using the states own data.

This issue of the "Gas Tax / Wage Tax" has been greatly broadcasts near and far in regards to multiple issues:

- * ODOT being fully funded for all current projects since 2017 bill.

- * ODOT loosing money yet no one is bothering to find where it went.

- * Seems reminiscent of our former Secretary of State getting a slap on the wrist of \$1,500 fee for accepting bribes but no other things, like unable to serve in government again, or anything else.

 - * Remote workers are taxed for this but their employer is in another state. So, not welcoming to remote workers.

- * We are building a new arena for a baseball team that no one really attends as per the economic report in addition to the fight to keep the blazers, which will cost taxpayers more to keep.
