Testimony against Tina Kotek's transportation plan to increase taxes and fees. Oregon residents are tired of paying more and have nothing to show for it. In addition, Kotek's plan asks the legislature to hand over its authority to raise taxes allowing hikes to be made without their vote. So much money can be used much more effectively to benefit more Oregonians and not just special interest. There is money, just spend it wisely. Quit punishing the residents of Oregon for terrible management, which raises costs on everything making life in this beautiful state difficult, unfriendly, and un-affordable.
