I have been small business owner for the last 20 years. Although I only have four full-time employees I offer a fair wage and benefits. Over the years it has become increasingly difficult to do so. The biggest reason? In Oregon we pay some of the highest taxes in the country. Every tax increase makes it more difficult for small companies to pay a decent wage let alone offer benefits. An additional \$5.8 billion tax over the next 10 years will make it that much harder for small businesses to compete with their large competitors.

If you think small business owners are making a fortune, think again. For example I currently make less than \$80,000 per year and I work about 12 hours a day. That's less than \$25 an hour. The governors bill would take even more of my hard earned money.
