This voter is disappointed by the deceptive tactics being used by the legislature to meet the long neglected highway infrastructure for the following reasons:

- This expenditure should have been addressed during the regular session as a higher priority than many other expenditures that are not core functions of state government
- Putting this core function outside the current revenue sources is the oldest budgetary trick in the book; holding the essential services hostage to leverage more revenue.
- This so called Road Tax revenue isn't even mostly about roads; a significant portion of the revenue goes to mass transit, a grossly over expensive way to move a small portion of Oregonians in prescribed ways.
- In addition, I understand that some of the proposed revenue is for functions unrelated to transportation. That would be dishonest.

In short, this act should fail the credibility test and be tabled.
