#### Public Hearing

HB 3902

Directs the Oregon State Board of Nursing to establish an advisory committee to study the nursing educator shortage and make recommendations to address the issues identified by the committee.

HB 3735 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office to hire permanent staff to convene affinity group task forces to develop recommendations on addressing health inequities.

HB 2940 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes the Task Force on Hemoglobinopathies and Sickle Cell Disease.

HB 3225

Specifies qualifications for a physician who is among the majority of the shareholders or directors of a professional corporation organized for the purpose of practicing medicine.

HB 3227

voids noncompetition agreements, nondisclosure agreements nondisparagement agreements and nonsolicitation agreements between certain business entities and medical professionals, with specified exceptions, and prohibits the business entities from retaliating against the medical professional for violating the void agreements.

HB 2221

Requires the Department of Consumer and Business Services to study health insurance.

HB 2015 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study outdated language in the provisions of ORS chapters 414 and 430.

HB 2202

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study redundancies in the provisions of ORS chapters 414 and 430.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study the behavioral health workforce.
- HB 3916 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs the Oregon Health Authority to award grants to certain recipients for certain workforce development activities.
