HB 2917 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study potential changes to the prioritized list of health services compiled by the Health Evidence Review Commission under ORS 414.

HB 2212 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes the Task Force on the Prioritized List of Health Services.

HB 2205

Extends the term of a contract entered into between the Oregon Health Authority and a coordinated care organization to 10 years.

HB 2794

Directs a health care facility to establish and maintain procedures that a staff member may use to submit to the health care facility a complaint regarding a medical supply or equipment that the staff member believes in good faith is faulty or dangerous.

HB 3225

Specifies qualifications for a physician who is among the majority of the shareholders or directors of a professional corporation organized for the purpose of practicing medicine.

HB 3227

Voids noncompetition agreements, nondisclosure agreements nondisparagement agreements and nonsolicitation agreements between certain business entities and medical professionals, with specified exceptions, and prohibits the business entities from retaliating against the medical professional for violating the void agreements.

HB 3675

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study staffing plans for hospitals.

HB 3134

Creates a process that exempts certain health care providers from prior authorization requirements under certain circumstances.

HB 3799

Creates a method by which a health care practitioner may offer to treat a patient who has a terminal disease or severe chronic disease with an investigational product not approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration.
