Work Session

- HB 3104 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs the Oregon Business Development Department to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit organization or local government association to serve as a statewide rural community resource center.
- HB 2120
Clarifies that a liquor store's amount of annual sales of alcoholic beverages used to determine liquor store class is not adjusted.
- HB 2304 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Removes the requirement that the amount of net proceeds from the Oregon State Lottery allocated to the County Fair Account not exceed \$1.53 million
- HB 3101 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Removes the requirement that the amount of net proceeds from the Oregon State Lottery allocated to the County Fair Account not exceed \$1.53 million
- HB 2527 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to the Union County Fair Association for the purpose of water and sewer improvements to the Union County Fairgrounds.
- HB 2145
Removes the requirement that the amount of net proceeds from the Oregon State Lottery allocated to the County Fair Account not exceed \$1.53 million
- HB 2171 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
Provides an exemption from the state transient lodging tax for a camping site on a county fairgrounds that has not more than 50 camping sites with both direct electrical hookups and individual sewer hookups.
- HB 3724
Prohibits advertising, packaging and labeling of marijuana items in a manner likely to cause minors to unlawfully possess or consume marijuana items.

Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study its role in economic development in Oregon.

HB 3315

Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to update and redesign its public website.

HB 2291

HB 2276

Requires the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study the commission.
