- HB 2152 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Directs the State Department of Energy to develop and implement a Statewide Geographic Diversity of Fueling Stations for Disaster Reserves Priority Action Plan.
- HB 2200 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Investment Council and the State Treasurer to take certain actions to reduce the carbon intensity of state investments and address certain investment risks relating to climate change.
- HB 2537 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Establishes the Veterans Waiver Program in the Oregon Health Authority to provide, beginning in 2026, medical assistance to low-income veterans who reside in Oregon.
- HB 2949 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to contract with a third party to study and assess financial assurance requirements for owners or operators of bulk oils and liquid fuels terminals.
- HB 2995 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Establishes the Task Force on Reparations and directs the task force to study and develop proposals for financial and nonfinancial reparations for Oregonians of African-American descent, develop appropriate methods for educating the public about the task force's findings and recommend appropriate remedies based on the task force's findings.
- HB 3077  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Allows local government employees to volunteer to support wildland fire suppression in emergency situations.

- HB 3450  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Directs the State Department of Energy to develop an energy storage transition plan for the critical energy infrastructure hub.
- HB 3532  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Historical Society, in consultation with the Oregon Geographic Names Board, federally recognized Indian tribes, state and local government leaders, local landowners and other interested parties, to compile a list of highways and geographic features that bear offensive names.
- HB 2346 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Creates the Office of Resilience and Emergency Management within the Department of Human Services.
- HB 3556 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Extends the permissible uses of net revenue from a new or increased local transient lodging tax to include public safety services and certain costs related to "community infrastructure.
- HB 3646  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2025 MEETING: Adds entities in which employees of the entity own at least 50 percent of the ownership interest in the entity directly or through an employee stock ownership plan to the list of sources to which a contracting agency may give preference in procuring goods or services for public contracts.
- HB 2050 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue  
Exempts from state income tax for a taxpayer who is a veteran all retirement pay or pension received for service in the Armed Forces of the United States.
- HB 3328  
Adds Grant County to the list of counties that may use road fund moneys from federal forest reserves payments for patrolling on the county's roads.
- HB 3366 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to the Rogue Siskiyou Regional Training Center.
- HB 3460 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs the Oregon Health Authority to administer a program to reimburse the cost of hyperbaric oxygen therapy for low-income veterans who have been diagnosed with traumatic brain injury or post-traumatic stress disorder and are ineligible for medical assistance.
- HB 3349 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Authorizes the State Forestry Department to take certain actions related to motor vehicles and other equipment used by the department.
- HB 3350 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Appropriates moneys out of the General Fund to the State Forestry Department for deposit in the Rangeland Protection Association Fund.
- HB 3654  
Sets maximum matching fund requirements for state grants to small incorporated cities for capital construction and municipal infrastructure.
- HB 3788 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs the Oregon Business Development Department to develop and administer a program to issue grants to certain medical facilities near a tsunami inundation zone to enable the facilities to store fuel and water for emergency purposes.

HB 3870 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Business Development Department for distribution to local governments and other entities for purposes related to public safety.

#### **Public Hearing**

HB 2344  
Requires the Department of Veterans' Affairs to keep the World War II memorial located in the Capitol Mall up to date and maintain an educational tool as part of the memorial.

HB 3754 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to create and maintain a registry of persons who are able and willing to provide emergency volunteer services.

HB 3773  
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to adopt by rule qualification criteria for veteran-specific personal health navigators as an additional category of traditional health workers.

HB 3062  
Requires local governments to map sensitive uses as part of a comprehensive plan.

HB 3831  
Requires the Department of Land Conservation and Development to study public health impacts of land use and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to land use no later than September 15, 2026.
