Public Hearing

SB 163

Requires the Judicial Department to study the judicial and administrative procedures to establish parentage and changes that would be necessary to implement the Uniform Parentage Act in this state.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 238

Requires the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study issues relating to law enforcement officers.

SB 1144

Requires the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study the amount of marijuana items that a marijuana retailer may sell.

SB 1186

Modifies provisions relating to the use of unmanned aircraft systems by law enforcement agencies.

Work Session

SB 233

Extends the statute of ultimate repose for claims for certain injuries from health care to 10 years from the date of the treatment, omission or operation upon which the action is based.

SB 424 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Health Authority for an electronic filing system related to the Oregon Death with Dignity Act.

SB 556

Allows a marijuana producer, marijuana wholesaler, marijuana processor or marijuana retailer to use a motion detection camera system at a licensed premises.

AGENDA (cont.) March 31, 2025

SB 558

Allows a marijuana licensee to provide samples of marijuana items to other marijuana licensees at temporary events registered with the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission.

SB 1111

Changes the term "marijuana" to "cannabis" in Oregon law.

SB 1173

Provides that a health care facility is not a manufacturer, distributor, seller or lessor of a product for purposes of a product liability civil action if the health care facility was not involved in the design or manufacture of the product.

Note change: SB 65 and SB 1003 removed.
