**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

The measure directs the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to study contract terms for point of sale systems. The measure directs DCBS to report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to commerce by September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) is a consumer protection and business regulatory agency. DCBS serves as a resource for consumers and businesses in several areas, including building safety, finance, and workplace health and safety. The divisions within DCBS include Building Codes, Financial Regulation, Oregon OSHA, and Workers' Compensation.

A point of sale system streamlines the checkout experience, allowing a business to process payments, record customer loyalty points, and update inventory. The global point of sale software market size was valued at USD 11.99 billion in 2022, according to a report by Grand View Research.
