




Program Outcomes

Law Enforcement Perspective

Thoughts from the Field...

- Offers of Deflection are triggered by a field contact where enforcement action is applicable.
- Outreach is done twice weekly where no criminal charges need be present and subjects are connected with service providers in the field or referred to organizations for assistance.
 - * This is not Deflection in Jackson County
- Deflection is a Behavioral Health program, so all participants must have a SUD nexus.

Programmatic Reflections...

- There are fewer eligible participants than anticipated.
- We are seeking pathways to ensuring accountability while connecting people to services
- Engaging with the LE challenges of this program coming on the heels of decriminalization; how do officers balance accountability for criminal activity with treatment opportunities?
- There is a recognized need to develop creative approaches to gain LE buy-in.
- Barriers to expanding eligible charges – DA staying away from crimes with a victim.

Lessons Learned, Opportunities, and Concerns

- Our program is only as good as the relationships between providers and criminal justice partners
- Deflection expectations for success should be driven by Behavioral Health experts
- We must get buy-in and understanding from our Law Enforcement partners
- Definition of “Deflection” seems to have changed which has led to new opportunities, but also generated confusion and frustration for the team with long-term investment in program development
- Lack of committed funding has made long-term planning/development difficult
 - Permanent Deflection Coordinator
 - Deflection Center
- Expansion of participation will benefit from extended hours
 - 24-Hour Center
 - Jail Deflection Opportunities
 - Referral Programs
