- 60 e-bikes, 15 cargo e-bikes





Findings to Date (2023-25)

- Total e-bike trips taken: **14,245**
- Total e-bike miles ridden: **42,112 miles**
- Trips replacing "Gas Car Drive Alone" trips: 4,633
- Number of vehicle miles reduced from Oregon's roads: **17,495 miles**
- Carbon pollution reduction: **7,376.79 lbs**
