Overview

Highly Successful

- In FFY 24, the Refugee Program provided legal services to 1,893 people
- More than 60% of participants submitted applications to US Citizenship and Immigration Services or immigration court
- 99% of adjudicated cases were approved

- Ukrainian Humanitarian

- Afghans Evacuated through Operation Allies Welcome (OAW)

Gaps and Ongoing Needs

- Legal assistance is essential for employment, stability, and long-term integration.
- There are no dedicated ongoing funding for legal services. All have been one-time investments or carve outs.
- Eligibility and allowable services are determined by the Office of Refugee Resettlement.
- Refugees and other immigration statuses don't have access to any of these services.
- There is a large gap between need and those served. Funding not sufficient to serve all eligible Ukrainians, Cubans and Haitians.
