RE: Statutory Civil Penalty and Enforcement Cost

Recovery for Licensing Agencies



Per your request, this memorandum identifies statutory civil penalty and enforcement cost recovery authorities for licensing agencies (Table 1, page 3). Agencies with licensing authority for a trade or profession were identified using the <a href="Oregon Blue Book">Oregon Blue Book</a>. LPRO searched the statutes identified on either the agency's webpage or in the Blue Book to identify civil penalty and enforcement cost recovery authorities. Results are representative but not necessarily comprehensive.

Results are organized based on statutory authority, meaning some are listed at the board level and others at the agency level. For example, the Health Licensing Office within the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) uses a single set of enforcement statutes for a wide range of professions including 14 licensing boards. In contrast, the various divisions of the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) administer dozens of different licensing enforcement statutes.

## Maximum Civil Penalties

The statutory construction and amounts of maximum civil penalties for licensing violations varies widely. Some establish a maximum per violation, others create tiers based on first or subsequent offenses, others create an annual maximum or a maximum that is undefined in statute, and others allow for un-capped recovery of ill-gotten gains. The highest maximum civil penalty identified in Table 1 is \$60,000 per violation for certain violations of Oregon Securities Law at the expense of a vulnerable person which may be assessed by the Financial Regulation Division of DCBS.

## Recovery of Enforcement Expenses

Fifteen (15) licensing agencies have statutory authority to assess the costs of disciplinary proceedings or actions, sometimes with a statutory maximum on the amount that can be recovered.

## Disposition of Civil Penalties

Recovered civil penalties are generally required to be deposited or credited to the licensing authority's account where the funds are continuously appropriated to the licensing authority for administration and enforcement. Certain civil penalties recovered by the Financial Regulation Division of DCBS, the Liquor and Cannabis Commission, and the Real Estate Agency must be deposited in the General Fund with no corresponding deposit back to the agency.
