- 1. What percentage of the state's purchasing is done through the marketplace today? Have any targets been set for expansion over the next year or the next 2-4 years?**

There are 465 active statewide price agreements available for state agencies (and OrCPP members) to search in Marketplace. Of those 465 agreements, 17 are currently purchasable in Marketplace. **Therefore, 3.7% of our active statewide price agreements are currently purchasable via Marketplace.**

We are still working on Calendar Year 2024 data. As a representation, during a single 2024 quarter, state agencies spent \$80,474,090 with DAS' statewide price agreements. Eleven of the statewide price agreements had allowable purchases

through Marketplace during that quarter. Those 11 price agreements had \$914,942 of spend by state agencies during the quarter, with \$47,072 of that total spent inside of OregonBuys. Therefore, 1.1% of state agencies' spend during the quarter was against statewide price agreements that were active and purchasable in OregonBuys Marketplace, with 5.1% of that spend being processed inside of OregonBuys.

DAS does not currently have specific expansion targets set for the next 2-4 years. However, there are currently 19 contracts in the onboarding queue to add into the catalogue.
