

SB 1144 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study the amount of marijuana items a licensed marijuana retailer may sell, and report to the interim committees related to business by September 15, 2026.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- No current THC limits per beverage or edible
- Sale limits are set by the Oregon Liquor and Control Commission

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The amendment replaces the measure, creating possession limits by THC quantity for cannabinoid edibles or liquid products, and defining containers for cannabinoids in liquid form.

Detailed Summary

- Adds unlawful possession limits for more than 10 grams of total delta-9-THC amounts in cannabinoid edibles or cannabinoid products in liquid form, unless the person is a marijuana licensee or licensee representative.
- Directs that a sealed container containing cannabinoid products in liquid form shall be considered a single container, regardless of container size or inclusion in a package of multiple containers.
- Authorizes the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to take any action necessary to effectuate the measure by the operative date.
- Sets an operative date of January 1, 2026, for the measure's substantive provisions.
- Takes effect in the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

FISCAL: Has minimal fiscal impact

REVENUE: No revenue impact

BACKGROUND:
