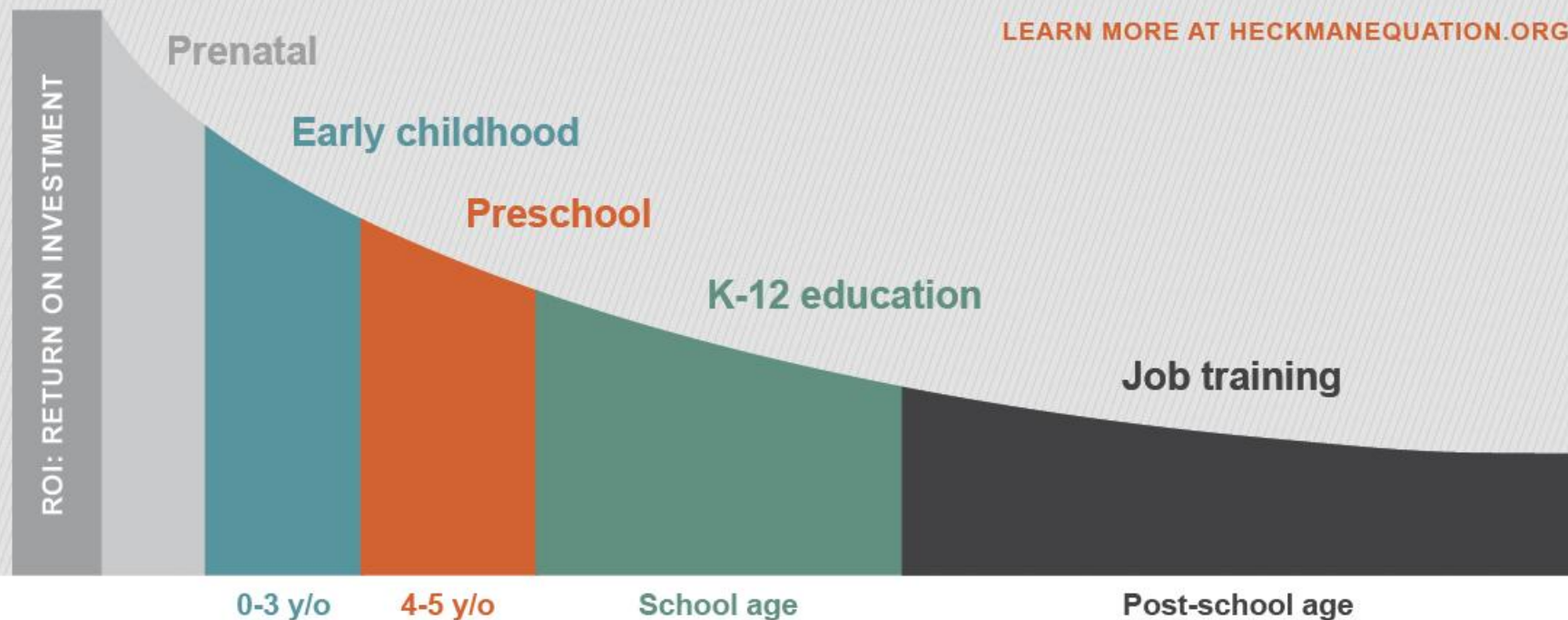

## HOUSING

SB 690

Prioritize pregnant people and families with babies for **rental assistance, eviction protection, and emergency housing assistance**, and increase the supply of **family-sized affordable housing** units.

## ENDING CHILD POVERTY

SB 694

Expand the **Oregon tax credits for kids** to provide **direct assistance to families** during the prenatal and postpartum periods.

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

SB 691

Expand availability of **integrated maternal substance use and mental health treatments** using evidence-based interventions including **Project Nurture/Nurture Oregon**.

## PERINATAL WORKFORCE

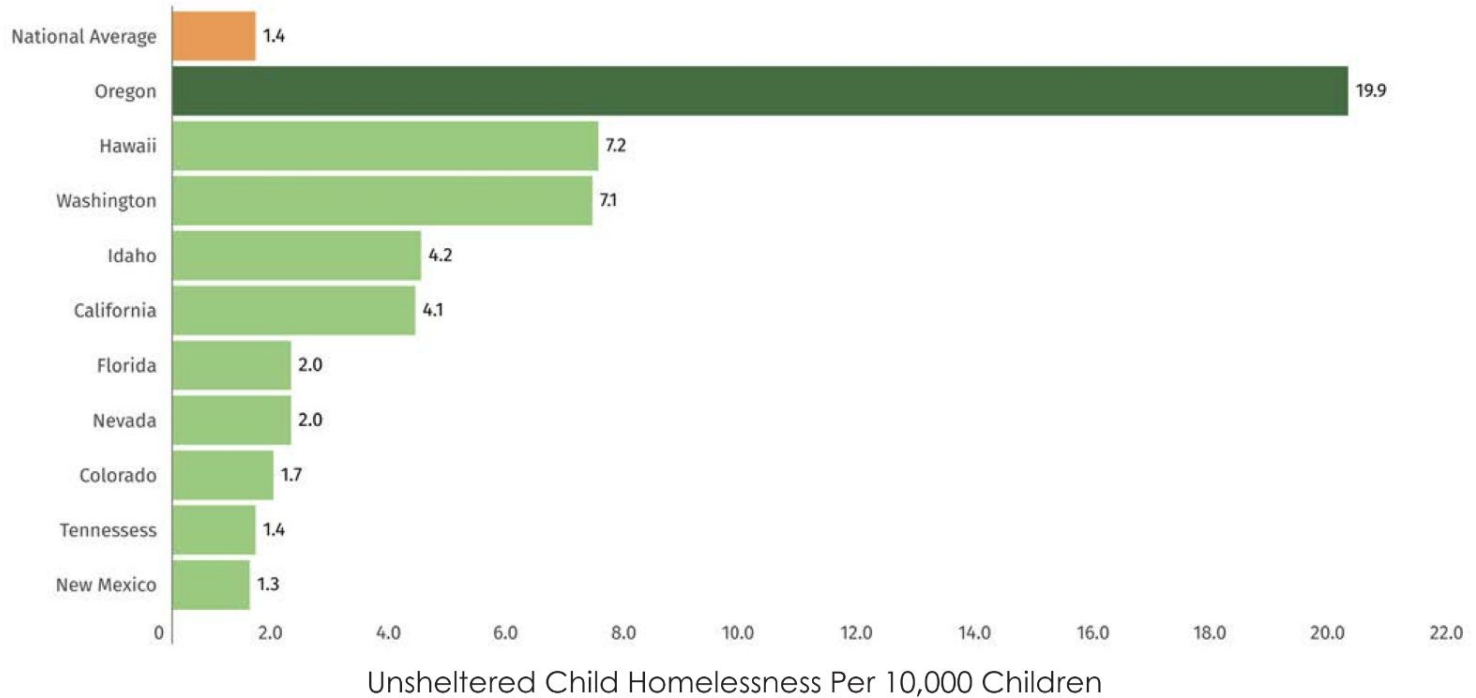
SB 692 & SB 693

Increase the numbers of **traditional health workers, including doulas, lactation counselors, and community health workers, as well as peer support specialists**, through trainings and financial incentives.

SB 695 Aligning Oregon's Coordinated Care Organizations with the upstream, preventative goals of Momnibus 2025.


## Oregon ranks worst in the country for unsheltered homelessness among children according to 2023 PIT data

# Keeping Babies Housed



**Preventing nonpayment evictions for those approved** for Health Related Social Needs housing benefits through Medicaid\*

Directs OHCS to prioritize **families with infants under 12 months of age** in making rules and policies aimed at stabilizing housing for families that are unhoused or at risk of homelessness

# Amendment Summary

---

- Better aligns bill with Oregon Judicial Department practices for easier implementation
  - Privacy Protections
  - Motion/Declaration
  - Timeline
  - Notice Language
- Negotiated in meetings with Oregon Judicial Department, Multifamily Northwest, Oregon Law Center, and our office
- No one got everything they wanted, no one got nothing they wanted
- Amendment does not substantively change the policy, but helps it work better
