House Bill 2662

Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act says that some law enforcement agencies have to have at least two officers in patrol cars. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.6).

Directs a municipal law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over a population of at least 350,000 to staff patrol vehicles with a minimum of two officers. Specifies an exception.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to law enforcement agencies.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, a municipal law 5 enforcement agency with jurisdiction over a municipality with a population of at least 350,000 6 shall staff all enclosed motor vehicles used for patrol duties with a minimum of two law 7 enforcement officers.

8 (2)(a) A municipal law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over a municipality with a 9 population of at least 350,000 may staff an enclosed motor vehicle used for patrol duties with 10 only one law enforcement officer if extraordinary circumstances prevent the agency from 11 complying with the requirement described in subsection (1) of this section.

(b) For each instance that a law enforcement agency is prevented from complying with the requirement described in subsection (1) of this section due to extraordinary circumstances, the agency shall provide written notice to the Department of Justice with an explanation of the specific circumstances.
