# House Bill 2680

Sponsored by Representative SMITH G (Presession filed.)

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Says that a firm that installs, repairs or remodels glass in a public building must be properly qualified to do the work if the firm wants to get public funds for the work. (Flesch Read-ability Score: 60.5).

Requires a contractor, as a condition of receiving public funds to install, repair or remodel a fenestration product or system in a public building, to have a national certification as a glazing contractor and at least one employee that has a national certification as an architectural glass and metal technician.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 455.560 to 6 455.580.

7 SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:

8 (a) "Fenestration product or system" means a window, glass, glazing or glazing system,

(2) A public agency that provides public funds to install, repair or remodel a fenestration 1 2 product or system in a public building that the public agency constructs, remodels or repairs and owns or leases shall require, as a condition of providing the public funds for the instal-3 lation, repair or remodeling, that: 4

(4) The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services may adopt rules and take any other action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the director, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, to undertake and exercise all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the director by section 2 of this 2025 Act.
