

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2684

- 1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 30.
- 2 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 29 and insert:
- 3 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 634.705 is amended to read:
- 4 “634.705. (1)(a) The governing body responsible for a school shall adopt an integrated pest
- 5 management plan for use on the campuses of the school. The governing body shall also adopt pro-
- 6 visions for:
- 7 “[a] (A) Designating an integrated pest management plan coordinator;
- 8 “[b] (B) Identifying plan coordinator responsibilities;
- 9 “[c] (C) Giving notices under ORS 634.740;
- 10 “[d] (D) Retaining pesticide application records under ORS 634.750;
- 11 “[e] (E) Providing a process for responding to inquiries and complaints about noncompliance
- 12 with the integrated pest management plan; and
- 13 “[f] (F) Conducting outreach to the school community about the school’s integrated pest man-
- 14 agement plan.
- 15 “(b) **Not less than once every five years, the governing body shall review the integrated**
- 16 **pest management plan, make any necessary updates and readopt the integrated pest man-**
- 17 **agement plan. A final integrated pest management plan must include the day, month and**
- 18 **year that the governing body adopted or readopted the plan.**
- 19 “(c) **A governing body shall make the integrated pest management plan available to the**
- 20 **public through the governing body’s website. A governing body may satisfy this paragraph**
- 21 **by including the integrated pest management plan with the healthy and safe schools plan,**
- 22 **adopted under ORS 332.331, posted on the governing body’s website.**
- 23 “(2) If a governing body has control over only part of a building, a structure or property where
- 24 a campus is located, the governing body may limit an integrated pest management plan to those
- 25 parts of the building, structure or property over which the governing body exerts substantial con-
- 26 trol.
- 27 “(3) A governing body is not required to adopt an integrated pest management plan for off-
- 28 campus buildings, structures or property, notwithstanding any incidental use for instruction.
- 29 “(4) Unless a governing body expressly provides otherwise, the application of a germicide,
- 30 disinfectant, sanitizer, deodorizer, antimicrobial agent or insecticidal soap at a campus is not subject
- 31 to the requirements for a pesticide application under an integrated pest management plan. However,
- 32 this subsection does not permit the application at a campus of a germicide, disinfectant, sanitizer,
- 33 deodorizer, antimicrobial agent or insecticidal soap that is a pesticide in a manner that is incon-
- 34 sistent with the goal of the integrated pest management plan.
- 35 “(5) *[A governing body shall adopt]* **The integrated pest management plan shall include a list**

1 of low-impact pesticides for use with the integrated pest management plan. The [*governing body*] **list**  
2 may include any product [*on the list*] except products that:

3 “(a) Contain a pesticide product or active ingredient that has the signal words ‘warning’ or  
4 ‘danger’ on the label;

5 “(b) Contain a pesticide product classified as a human carcinogen or probable human carcinogen  
6 under the United States Environmental Protection Agency 1986 Guidelines for Carcinogen Risk As-  
7 sessment; or

8 “(c) Contain a pesticide product classified as carcinogenic to humans or likely to be  
9 carcinogenic to humans under the United States Environmental Protection Agency 2003 Draft Final  
10 Guidelines for Carcinogen Risk Assessment.

11 **“SECTION 2. For integrated pest management plans adopted before the effective date of**  
12 **this 2025 Act, a governing body shall review, update and readopt the integrated pest man-**  
13 **agement plan, as required by ORS 634.705 (1)(b), no later than January 1, 2027, or five years**  
14 **from the date of the most recent approval of the plan, whichever is later.”.**

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
