House Bill 2810

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs the OPDC to study law changes needed for public defense. The Act directs the OPDC to provide the results of the study to the legislature by May 1, 2026. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.0).

Directs the Oregon Public Defense Commission to study law changes needed to implement Senate Bill 337 (2023). Requires the commission to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than May 1, 2026.

Sunsets January 2, 2027.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to the Oregon Public Defense Commission.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Public Defense Commission shall study whether legislative changes are needed in order to effectively implement chapter 281, Oregon Laws 2023 (Enrolled Senate Bill 337 (2023)).
 - (2) The commission shall provide the results of the study, including any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 no later than May 1, 2026.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
