House Bill 2822

Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells an agency to study certain effects on wolf populations. The Act tells the agency to report on the study. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.9).

Requires the State Department of Fish and Wildlife to submit a report on the effects on Oregon wolf populations of changes in certain protections for the gray wolf during the last 10 years.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to a report on Canis lupus; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall produce a report on the effects on Oregon wolf populations of changes made during the last 10 years in protections for Canis lupus, commonly known as the gray wolf, under the state lists of threatened species or endangered species established pursuant to ORS 496.172 (2).
 - (2) On or before September 15, 2026, the department shall submit the report identified in subsection (1) of this section to a committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
