

# House Bill 3126

Sponsored by Representative OWENS; Representative MCINTIRE (Pre-session filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells the TSPC to create a pilot program to license some types of teachers. (Flesch Readability Score: 79.8).

Directs the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to establish by rule a five-year pilot program to license teachers other than career and technical education teachers in this state in a manner similar to the career and technical education teaching license program.

Sunset on January 2, 2031.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to licensure of teachers providing classroom instruction in subjects other than career and  
3 technical education.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission shall by rule establish a**  
6 **five-year pilot program to license teachers other than career and technical education teach-**  
7 **ers in this state in a manner similar to the career and technical education teaching license**  
8 **program adopted by rule by the commission.**

9 **(2) The rules must:**

10 **(a) Allow for a school district, in partnership with a Regional Educator Network estab-**  
11 **lished by the Educator Advancement Council, to convene an instructor appraisal committee.**

12 **(b) Target teacher candidates seeking to provide classroom instruction on subjects other**  
13 **than career and technical education, including but not limited to, math, science and social**  
14 **studies.**

15 **(c) Require teacher candidates to receive mentorship through the local Regional Educa-**  
16 **tor Network.**

17 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed January 2, 2031.**
