SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Directs the Department of the State Fire Marshal to establish a grant program to facilitate the retrofitting of dwellings [and accessory structures] to reduce vulnerability to wildfire.

Appropriates moneys to the department out of the General Fund for the program.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

2	Relating to reducing the vulnerability of structures to wildfire; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) In collaboration with the Department of Consumer and Business Ser-
5	vices, the Department of the State Fire Marshal shall establish and implement a grant pro-
6	gram called the Wildfire Prepared Structure Program to facilitate the retrofitting of
7	dwellings existing on the effective date of this 2025 Act, as well as dwellings constructed
8	following wildfire damage, to be resistant and resilient to wildfire.
9	(2) To implement the program, the Department of the State Fire Marshal shall:
10	(a) Publish a list of eligible retrofits and materials that reduce the vulnerability of
11	structures to wildfire and flying embers, as identified in section R327 of the Oregon Resi-
12	dential Specialty Code or other relevant industry best practices and standards.
13	(b) Consider the relative cost-effectiveness of the retrofits and materials.
14	(c) Award individual grants to persons and block grants to counties for the counties to
15	award as individual grants to persons.
16	(d) Establish ranking and criteria for awarding individual grants that include a prefer-
17	ence for projects that:
18	(A) Benefit persons who live in the wildland-urban interface, as defined pursuant to ORS
19	477.015 and 477.027.
20	(B) Benefit persons who implement defensible space requirements described in ORS
21	476.392.

22(C) Benefit persons in socially vulnerable communities.

23(D) Benefit low-income persons who have demonstrated financial need.

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(E) Benefit persons whose homes have been destroyed or significantly damaged by a 1 wildfire for which authority has been exercised under the Emergency Conflagration Act set 2 out in ORS 476.510 to 476.610. 3 (e) Establish formats by which persons who receive individual grants and counties that 4 receive block grants must report to the State Fire Marshal. 5 (3) A person who receives an individual grant shall: 6 (a) Complete the grant project on a timeline approved when the individual grant is 7awarded. 8 9 (b) Report to the State Fire Marshal in a format designated pursuant to subsection (2)(e) 10 of this section. (4) A county that receives a block grant shall report to the State Fire Marshal in a for-11 12mat designated pursuant to subsection (2)(e) of this section. (5) The department, and counties that receive block grants, shall accept applications for 13 individual grants: 14 (a) At least once per year, for dwellings existing on the effective date of this 2025 Act, 15 on a date or dates determined by the department. 16 (b) As needed, for dwellings constructed following wildfire damage. 1718 (6) The department may adopt rules as needed to implement this section, in consultation with other agencies, local governments, nongovernmental organizations and the Wildfire 19 Programs Advisory Council established by ORS 476.690. 20SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-2122ated to the Department of the State Fire Marshal, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____, for carrying out the provisions of section 1 23of this 2025 Act. This appropriation is available continuously until expended for the purpose 24specified in this section. 25

26 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 27 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 28 on its passage.

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
