## Senate Bill 1108

Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act makes new laws that grant employees time off from work to donate blood. (Flesch Readability Score: 90.0).

Requires employers to allow employees to take up to four hours of blood donation leave per calendar year without the loss of time, pay or benefits.

## 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to paid time off for employees to donate blood.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - **SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section:
  - (a) "Blood donation leave" means time off from work that is taken to donate blood to any off-premises blood donation.
    - (b) "Employer" has the meaning given that term in ORS 653.010.
  - (c) "Off-premises blood donation" means any voluntary and noncompensatory blood donation made in connection with a program for the drawing of blood that is:
  - (A) Approved by the American Association of Blood Banks or the American Red Cross; and
    - (B) Located off of the employer's premises.
    - (2) An employer in this state shall permit an employee to use blood donation leave without loss of time, pay or benefits. Blood donation leave may be taken by an employee for up to four hours per calendar year. Blood donation leave is in addition to any other accrued paid leave to which an employee may be entitled.
