

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5526

2 **“SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the**  
3 **biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the**  
4 **following purposes:**

22 **Medicare receipts and including federal funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security**  
23 **Supplemental Security Income recoveries and the Child Care and Development Fund, but**  
24 **excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received**  
25 **by the Department of Human Services, for the following purposes:**

14 **Act, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for the following purposes:**

28 **“SECTION 4. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, expenditures by the Department**  
29 **of Human Services for federal supplemental nutrition assistance payments are not limited.**

30 **“SECTION 5. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
31 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect**  
32 **July 1, 2025.”.**

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
