Senate Bill 911

Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs DHS to adopt a method of payment for foster child transition supports. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8).

Requires the Department of Human Services to adopt a methodology for payments made to providers of independent living transition services provided to foster children.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to independent living transition services; and prescribing an effective date.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Department of Human Services shall prescribe by rule a uniform pay-

ment methodology for providers of independent living program transition services for foster
children that:

7 (1) Takes into consideration the number of hours a provider spends providing in-person
8 services;

9 (2) Takes into consideration the amount of time a provider spends on outreach to foster 10 children who are difficult to reach, including time locating and communicating with foster

11 children and encouraging foster children to enroll in transition services; and

12 (3) Ensures adequate capacity to provide services, based on the average monthly popu-13 lation served over the prior 12 months, to ensure that staff is not lost during participation

14 fluctuations.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2025 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2025
regular session of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
