Senate Bill 934

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Tells school districts how to identify TAG children. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.2). Prescribes requirements for the identification of talented and gifted children.

2	Relating to the identification of talented and gifted children; amending ORS 343.407.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 343.407 is amended to read:
5	343.407. School districts shall identify talented and gifted [students] children enrolled in public
6	schools under rules adopted by the State Board of Education. The rules must require school dis-
7	tricts to:
8	(1) Allow any person who knows the child to recommend that a child be screened for
9	identification as a talented and gifted child;
10	(2) Provide a screening of a child recommended under subsection (1) of this section;
11	(3) Accept recommendations under subsection (1) of this section throughout the school
12	year and to provide screenings as needed throughout the school year;
13	(4) Directly inform parents of the process to recommend that a child be screened for
14	identification as a talented and gifted child; and
15	(5) Provide information on the school district's website about the process to recommend
16	that a child be screened for identification as a talented and gifted child.
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
