

Senate Concurrent Resolution 3

Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The measure creates a rule for the Senate and the House that requires a written okay from the sponsor before an Act can start when the Act is signed. (Flesch Readability Score: 72.3).

Requires written authorization from the chief sponsor of a bill before a legislative concept containing an emergency clause may be accepted for filing.

Requires written authorization from the sponsor of the amendment before an amendment that adds an emergency clause to a bill may be adopted by a committee.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 **Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

3 (1) This resolution constitutes a rule of proceeding of the Senate and of the House of Repre-
4 sentatives of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly.

5 (2) A legislative concept that contains an emergency clause may not be accepted for filing by
6 the Secretary of the Senate or the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives unless the concept
7 is accompanied by written authorization for the emergency clause that is signed by the chief sponsor
8 of the bill.

9 (3) An amendment that amends a bill so as to include an emergency clause in the bill may not
10 be adopted by a committee unless the committee receives written authorization for the emergency
11 clause that is signed by the amendment sponsor.
