Senate Joint Resolution 16

Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Suggests a change to the Oregon Constitution that would get rid of the death penalty. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8).

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution prohibiting the death penalty.

Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

2	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
3	PARAGRAPH 1. Section 40, Article I of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended
4	to read:
5	Sec. 40. A sentence of death may not be imposed or executed. [Notwithstanding sections
6	15 and 16 of this Article, the penalty for aggravated murder as defined by law shall be death upon
7	unanimous affirmative jury findings as provided by law and otherwise shall be life imprisonment with
8	minimum sentence as provided by law.]

10	PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the
11	people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout
12	this state.
