## **Senate Joint Resolution 5**

Sponsored by Senator MANNING JR; Senators GOLDEN, PATTERSON, PROZANSKI. (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The measure amends the Constitution. The measure lets voters register on the day of an election. The amendment goes to the people to approve or reject at the next election. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.3).

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require voters to be registered by the day of an election.

Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next general election.

## JOINT RESOLUTION

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

- **PARAGRAPH 1.** Section 2, Article II of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended to read:
- **Sec. 2.** Qualifications of electors. (1) Every citizen of the United States is entitled to vote in all elections not otherwise provided for by this Constitution if [such] the citizen:
  - (a) Is 18 years of age or older;

- (b) Has resided in this state during the six months immediately preceding the election, except that provision may be made by law to permit a person who has resided in this state less than 30 days immediately preceding the election, but who is otherwise qualified under this subsection, to vote in the election for candidates for nomination or election for President or Vice President of the United States or elector of President and Vice President of the United States; and
- (c) Is registered not [less than 20 calendar days immediately preceding any] later than the day of any election in the manner provided by law.
- (2) Provision may be made by law to require that persons who vote upon questions of levying special taxes or issuing public bonds shall be taxpayers.

PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout this state.
