**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3940**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “wildfire;” delete the rest of
2 the line and lines 3 through 5 and insert “creating new provisions; amending
3 ORS 242.702, 291.055, 321.005, 321.015, 476.565, 477.001, 477.205, 477.230,
4 477.270, 477.277, 477.281, 477.295, 477.440, 477.445, 477.450, 477.455, 477.460,
5 477.750, 477.755, 477.760, 477.775, 477.777, 478.010, 478.120 and 478.140; repeal-
6 ing ORS 476.310, 476.320, 476.330, 476.340, 477.415, 477.880, 477.960 and 477.970;
7 prescribing an effective date; and providing for revenue raising that requires
8 approval by a three-fifths majority.”.

11 **“BEVERAGE CONTAINER SURCHARGE**

12
13 **“SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part**
14 **of ORS 459A.700 to 459A.744.**

15 **“SECTION 2. (1) A dealer shall collect a five cent surcharge on each**
16 **beverage container sold in this state. At least once per quarter, a**
17 **dealer shall transfer the full amount of surcharges collected under this**
18 **section to the Department of the State Fire Marshal.**

19 **“(2)(a) The department shall deposit half of the amounts received**
20 **under this section in the State Fire Marshal Mobilization Fund estab-**
21 **lished under ORS 476.565.**

1 **“(b) The department shall transfer half of the amounts received**
2 **under this section to the State Forestry Department for deposit in the**
3 **Landscape Resiliency Fund established under ORS 477.502.**

4 **“(3) The Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission, in consultation**
5 **with the Department of the State Fire Marshal, shall adopt rules**
6 **necessary for the administration of this section.**

7
8 **“INSURANCE RETALIATORY TAX**

9
10 **“SECTION 3. (1) Once per year, the Department of Consumer and**
11 **Business Services shall determine the aggregate amount of revenue**
12 **collected by the department pursuant to the retaliatory tax imposed**
13 **on insurers under ORS 731.854.**

14 **“(2)(a) The department shall transfer an amount equal to half of the**
15 **amount determined under subsection (1) of this section to the De-**
16 **partment of the State Fire Marshal for deposit in the State Fire Mar-**
17 **shal Mobilization Fund established under ORS 476.565.**

18 **“(b) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall**
19 **transfer an amount equal to half of the amount determined under**
20 **subsection (1) of this section to the State Forestry Department for**
21 **deposit in the Landscape Resiliency Fund established under ORS**
22 **477.502.**

24 **“ENDING BALANCE**

25
26 **“SECTION 4. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section,**
27 **immediately after the time of each transfer to the Oregon Rainy Day**
28 **Fund under ORS 293.146, an amount equal to one-half percent of the**
29 **amount of General Fund appropriations for the preceding biennium**
30 **shall be transferred in equal shares from the General Fund to the**

1 **State Fire Marshal Mobilization Fund established under ORS 476.565**
2 **and to the Landscape Resiliency Fund established under ORS 477.502.**

3 **“(2) If the remaining ending balance does not equal or exceed the**
4 **amount required to be transferred under subsection (1) of this section,**
5 **then an amount equal to the remaining ending balance shall be**
6 **transferred in equal shares from the General Fund to the State Fire**
7 **Marshal Mobilization Fund established under ORS 476.565 and to the**
8 **Landscape Resiliency Fund established under ORS 477.502.**

9 **“(3) As used in this section:**

10 **“(a) ‘Ending balance’ has the meaning given that term in ORS**
11 **293.146.**

12 **“(b) ‘General Fund appropriations’ has the meaning given that term**
13 **in ORS 293.146.**

14 **“(c) ‘Remaining ending balance’ means an ending balance, minus**
15 **the amount actually transferred to the Oregon Rainy Day Fund under**
16 **ORS 293.146 after the biennium to which the ending balance relates.**

“OREGON RAINY DAY FUND

19

20 **“SECTION 5. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 293.144, an amount equal to**
21 **25 percent of the amount held in the Oregon Rainy Day Fund imme-**
22 **diately prior to the transfers required under this section is transferred**
23 **from the Oregon Rainy Day Fund to the State Fire Marshal**
24 **Mobilization Fund established under ORS 476.565. The transfer shall**
25 **be made on September 1, 2025.**

26 **“(2) Notwithstanding ORS 293.144, an amount equal to 25 percent**
27 **of the amount held in the Oregon Rainy Day Fund immediately prior**
28 **to the transfers required under this section is transferred from the**
29 **Oregon Rainy Day Fund to the Landscape Resiliency Fund established**
30 **under ORS 477.502. The transfer shall be made on September 1, 2025.**

1 **“FOREST PRODUCTS HARVEST TAX FOR**
2 **WILDFIRE MITIGATION AND SUPPRESSION**

3
4 **“SECTION 6.** ORS 321.015 is amended to read:

5 “321.015. (1) For the calendar years beginning January 1, [2024] **2026**, and
6 January 1, [2025] **2027**, there is levied a privilege tax of 90.00 cents per
7 thousand feet, board measure, upon taxpayers for the privilege of harvesting
8 of all merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands. Subject to ORS
9 321.145, the proceeds of the tax shall be transferred as provided in ORS
10 321.152 (2) to the Forest Research and Experiment Account for use for the
11 forest resource research, experimentation and studies described in ORS
12 526.215 and for the Forest Research Laboratory established under ORS
13 526.225.

14 “(2)(a) [*Except as provided in ORS 477.760,*] In addition to the tax levied
15 by subsection (1) of this section, there is levied a forest products harvest tax
16 upon taxpayers of [62.5] **100** cents per thousand feet, board measure, for the
17 privilege of harvesting all merchantable forest products harvested on
18 forestlands for the payment of benefits related to fire suppression as provided
19 in ORS 321.005 to 321.185, 321.560 to 321.600 and 477.440 to 477.460.

20 **“(b)(A) The rate set under paragraph (a) of this subsection for any**
21 **calendar year shall be adjusted by the percentage, if any, by which the**
22 **monthly averaged Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers,**
23 **West Region (All Items) for the 12 consecutive months ending August**
24 **31 of the prior calendar year exceeds the monthly averaged index for**
25 **the 12 consecutive months ending August 31, 2024.**

26 **“(B) The adjustment computed under subparagraph (A) of this**
27 **paragraph shall be rounded to the nearest one-tenth of a cent.**

28 “(3) For the calendar years beginning January 1, [2024] **2026**, and January
29 1, [2025] **2027**, in addition to the taxes levied under subsections (1) and (2)
30 of this section, there is levied a privilege tax upon taxpayers for the privilege

1 of harvesting all merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands in
2 the amount of 253.46 cents per thousand feet, board measure, for the purpose
3 of administering the Oregon Forest Practices Act in an amount not to exceed
4 40 percent of the total expenditures approved by the Legislative Assembly for
5 this purpose, including salary adjustments approved by the Legislative As-
6 sembly for fiscal years [2024] **2026** and [2025] **2027**.

7 “(4) For the calendar years beginning January 1, 2024, and January 1,
8 2025, in addition to the taxes levied by subsections (1) to (3) of this section,
9 there is levied a privilege tax of 21 cents per thousand feet, board measure,
10 upon taxpayers for the privilege of harvesting all merchantable forest pro-
11 ducts harvested on forestlands. Subject to ORS 321.145, the proceeds of the
12 tax shall be transferred as provided in ORS 321.152 (5) to the subaccount
13 established pursuant to ORS 350.520 for use by Oregon State University for
14 the purpose of making investments in professional forestry education at the
15 College of Forestry.

16 “(5) Subject to subsection (6) of this section, the taxes shall be measured
17 by and be applicable to each per thousand feet, board measure, on the total
18 quantity of forest products harvested in this state measured by use of any
19 log scale which is or may be in general use in the logging industry and
20 which is designed to measure total volume of merchantable forest products
21 in board feet. However, if the Department of Revenue finds that the scale
22 used by any taxpayer in computing the taxes due under ORS 321.005 to
23 321.185 and 321.560 to 321.600 does not accurately reflect the total quantity
24 of merchantable forest products harvested by the taxpayer, it may require the
25 taxpayer to adopt another log scale in general use in the industry which in
26 the department’s opinion will accurately reflect merchantable harvest in
27 board feet.

28 “(6) The first 25,000 feet, board measure, of forest products harvested an-
29 nually by any taxpayer during each calendar year shall be excluded from the
30 total quantity of harvested forest products that constitutes the measure of

1 the taxes under ORS 321.005 to 321.185 and 321.560 to 321.600.

2 “(7)(a) Not later than March 10 of each odd-numbered year, the Legisla-
3 tive Assembly shall begin considering the biennial forest products harvest
4 tax rates levied under subsections (1), (3) and (4) of this section.

5 “(b) Upon request of the Legislative Revenue Officer or the Legislative
6 Fiscal Officer, the State Forestry Department shall provide the respective
7 officers with relevant timber harvest data for the purposes of paragraph (a)
8 of this subsection.

9 **“SECTION 7. The amendments to 321.015 by section 6 of this 2025**
10 **Act apply to calendar years beginning on or after January 1, 2026.**

11 **“SECTION 8.** ORS 321.005 is amended to read:

12 “321.005. As used in ORS 321.005 to 321.185[,] **and** 321.560 to 321.600 [*and*
13 *477.440 to 477.460*], unless the context requires otherwise:

14 “[*(1) ‘Board’ means the State Board of Forestry.*]

15 “[*(2) ‘Protected forestlands’ means those lands which are protected from the*
16 *starting or spread of fire thereon or therefrom by:*]

17 “[*(a) The State Forester, with the approval of the board;*]

18 “[*(b) The United States of America through contract with the State*
19 *Forester;*]

20 “[*(c) Any forest protective agency under contract with the State Forester or*
21 *the board pursuant to ORS 477.406; or*]

22 “[*(d) Any forest protective agency, described in paragraph (c) of this sub-*
23 *section, under an agreement with the United States of America wherein such*
24 *agency agrees to protect specific federal forestlands and, in return, the United*
25 *States of America agrees to protect specific lands of such agency.*]

26 “[*(3) ‘Department’ means the Department of Revenue.*]

27 “[*(4) ‘Committee’ means the Emergency Fire Cost Committee.*]

28 **“(1) ‘Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, West Region**
29 **(All Items)’ means the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consum-**
30 **ers, West Region (All Items), as published by the Bureau of Labor**

1 **Statistics of the United States Department of Labor.**

2 “[5] (2) ‘Forestland’ means any land producing forest products.

3 “[6] (3) ‘Forest products’ means products from harvested timber, but does
4 not include products from short rotation fiber grown under agricultural
5 conditions as described in ORS 321.267 (3) or 321.824 (3), western juniper or
6 products from harvested western juniper.

7 “[7] (4) ‘Harvest’ means the point at which timber that has been cut,
8 severed, or removed for purposes of sale or use is first measured in the or-
9 dinary course of business as determined by reference to common practice in
10 the timber industry.

11 “[8] (5) ‘Merchantable stand of timber’ means any stand on forestlands
12 containing living or dead timber which is being or can be harvested.

13 “[9] *‘Taxpayer’ means the owner of timber at time of harvest.*]

14 **“(6) ‘Owner of timber’ means any individual or combination of in-
15 dividuals, partnership, firm, corporation or association of whatever
16 nature holding title to harvested timber by virtue of:**

17 **“(a) An instrument of conveyance;**

18 **“(b) The harvesting of the timber; or**

19 **“(c) The harvesting of the timber and payment therefor.**

20 “[10] (7) ‘Taxes’ means the taxes provided for in ORS 321.015.

21 “[11] *‘Owner of timber’ means any individual or combination of individ-
22 uals, partnership, firm, corporation or association of whatever nature holding
23 title to harvested timber by virtue of:]*

24 *“(a) An instrument of conveyance;]*

25 *“(b) The harvesting of the timber; or]*

26 *“(c) The harvesting of the timber and payment therefor.]*

27 **“(8) ‘Taxpayer’ means the owner of timber at time of harvest.**

28 “[12] (9) ‘Timber’ means all logs which can be measured in board feet
29 and other forest products as determined by department rule.

30 **“SECTION 9. ORS 477.415 is repealed.**

1 **“STATE FORESTRY DEPARTMENT LARGE WILDFIRE FUND**

2
3 **“SECTION 10. (1) The State Forestry Department Large Wildfire**
4 **Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from**
5 **the General Fund.**

6 **“(2) The State Forestry Department Large Wildfire Fund shall be**
7 **held by the State Treasurer as a fund for use by the State Forestry**
8 **Department for wildfire mitigation and suppression. The State Treas-**
9 **urer shall deposit and invest moneys in the fund as provided by law,**
10 **taking into account its uses. Interest earned by the fund shall be**
11 **credited to the fund.**

12 **“(3) The fund consists of moneys appropriated by the Legislative**
13 **Assembly for deposit in the fund and other moneys appropriated to,**
14 **allocated to, deposited in or transferred to the fund by the Legislative**
15 **Assembly or otherwise.**

16
17 **“DEFINITION OF ‘CENTRALIZED ADMINISTRATION COSTS’**

18
19 **“SECTION 11. ORS 477.001 is amended to read:**

20 **“477.001. As used in this chapter[, unless the context otherwise requires]:**

21 **“(1) ‘Additional fire hazard’ means a hazard that has been determined to**
22 **exist by the forester pursuant to ORS 477.580.**

23 **“(2) ‘Board’ means the State Board of Forestry.**

24 **“(3) ‘Campfire’ means any open fire used for cooking, personal warmth,**
25 **lighting, ceremonial or aesthetic purposes that is hand built and that is not**
26 **associated with any debris disposal activities.**

27 **“(4) ‘Centralized administration costs’ means all costs associated**
28 **with:**

29 **“(a) Administration of the State Forestry Department;**

30 **“(b) The following services, provided statewide and in areas of this**

1 **state by the department:**

2 **“(A) Fire management on forestland;**

3 **“(B) Emergency response and support; and**

4 **“(C) Other services not described in this paragraph; and**

5 **“(c) The procurement of supplies related to purposes described in**
6 **this subsection.**

7 “[4] (5) ‘Department’ means the State Forestry Department.

8 “[5] (6) ‘District’ means a forest protection district organized under ORS
9 477.225.

10 “[6] (7) ‘Every reasonable effort’ means the use of the reasonably avail-
11 able personnel and equipment under the supervision and control of an owner
12 or operator, which are needed and effective to fight the fire in the judgment
13 of the forester and which can be brought to bear on the fire in a timely
14 fashion.

15 “[7] (8) ‘Fire season’ means a period designated pursuant to ORS 477.505.

16 “[8] (9) ‘Fiscal year’ means the period beginning on July 1 of any year
17 and ending on June 30 of the next year.

18 “[9] (10) ‘Forestland’ means any woodland, brushland, timberland,
19 grazing land or clearing that, during any time of the year, contains enough
20 forest growth, slashing or vegetation to constitute, in the judgment of the
21 forester, a fire hazard, regardless of how the land is zoned or taxed. As used
22 in this subsection, ‘clearing’ means any grassland, improved area, lake,
23 meadow, mechanically or manually cleared area, road, rocky area, stream or
24 other similar forestland opening that is surrounded by or contiguous to
25 forestland and that has been included in areas classified as forestland under
26 ORS 526.305 to 526.370.

27 “[10] (11) ‘Forest patrol assessment’ means the costs levied and assessed
28 under ORS 477.270.

29 “[11] (12) ‘Forest protective association’ or ‘association’ means an asso-
30 ciation, group or agency composed of owners of forestlands, organized for the

1 purpose of protecting such forestlands from fire.

2 “[~~(12)~~] **(13)** ‘Forest resource’ means the various types of vegetation
3 normally growing on Oregon’s forestland, the associated harvested products
4 and the associated residue, including but not limited to brush, grass, logs,
5 saplings, seedlings, trees and slashing.

6 “[~~(13)~~] **(14)** ‘Forester’ means the State Forester or authorized represen-
7 tative.

8 “[~~(14)~~] **(15)** ‘Governing body’ of a county means the county court or board
9 of county commissioners.

10 “[~~(15)~~] **(16)** ‘Grazing land’ is defined by ORS 477.205.

11 “[~~(16)~~] **(17)** ‘Open fire’ means any outdoor fire that occurs in such a
12 manner that combustion air is not effectively controlled and combustion
13 products are not effectively vented through a stack or chimney.

14 “[~~(17)~~] **(18)** ‘Operation’ means any industrial activity, any development or
15 any improvement on forestland inside or within one-eighth of one mile of a
16 forest protection district, including but not limited to the harvesting of for-
17 est tree species, the clearing of land, the use of power-driven machinery and
18 the use of fire, excluding, however, the culture and harvesting of agricultural
19 crops.

20 “[~~(18)~~] **(19)** ‘Operation area’ means the area on which an operation is be-
21 ing conducted and the area on which operation activity may have resulted
22 in the ignition of a fire.

23 “[~~(19)~~] **(20)** ‘Operation in progress’ means that time when workers are on
24 an operation area for the purpose of an operation, including the period of
25 time when fire watches are required to be on the operation area pursuant
26 to ORS 477.665.

27 “[~~(20)~~] **(21)** ‘Operator’ means any person who, either personally or through
28 employees, agents, representatives or contractors, is carrying on or has car-
29 ried on any operation.

30 “[~~(21)~~] **(22)** ‘Owner’ means an individual, a combination of individuals, a

1 partnership, a corporation, the State of Oregon or a political subdivision
2 thereof, or an association of any nature that holds an ownership interest in
3 land.

4 “[22] (23) ‘Political subdivision’ includes, but is not limited to, counties,
5 cities and special districts.

6 “[23] (24) ‘Rangeland’ is defined by ORS 477.315.

7 “[24] (25) ‘Routine road maintenance’ is defined by ORS 477.625.

8 “[25] (26) ‘Side’ means any single unit of a logging operation employing
9 power-driven machinery.

10 “[26] (27) ‘Slashing’ means the forest debris or refuse on any forestland
11 resulting from the cutting, killing, pruning, severing or removal of brush,
12 trees or other forest growth.

13 “[27] (28) ‘State Forester’ means the person appointed State Forester
14 pursuant to ORS 526.031 or the person serving in the position on an interim
15 or delegated basis.

16 “[28] (29) ‘Summit of the Cascade Mountains’ is considered to be a line
17 beginning at the intersection of the northern boundary of the State of
18 Oregon and the western boundary of Wasco County; thence southerly along
19 the western boundaries of Wasco, Jefferson, Deschutes and Klamath Coun-
20 ties to the southern boundary of the State of Oregon.

21 “[29] (30) ‘Timberland’ is defined by ORS 477.205.

22 “[30] (31) ‘Warden’ means a fire warden appointed under ORS 477.355.

23

24 “FOREST PROTECTION DISTRICTS

25

26 “**SECTION 12.** ORS 477.205 is amended to read:

27 “477.205. As used in ORS 477.205 to 477.281[, *unless the context requires*
28 *otherwise*]:

29 “(1) ‘**Budget**’ means an estimate of the amount of moneys a forest
30 **protection district needs for preparedness for, and for the prevention**

1 **and suppression of, forest fires on forestland.**

2 “[~~(1)~~] **(2)** ‘Grazing land’ means forestland, within a forest protection dis-
3 trict, that has been classified as Class 3, agricultural class, as provided by
4 ORS 526.305 to 526.370.

5 “[~~(2)~~] **(3)** ‘Timberland’ means forestland, within a forest protection dis-
6 trict, that has not been classified as Class 3, agricultural class, under ORS
7 526.305 to 526.370.

8 **“SECTION 13.** ORS 477.230 is amended to read:

9 “477.230. (1) The annual cost of protection provided by the [*forester*] **State**
10 **Forester** for forestland within a forest protection district shall be as [*fol-*
11 *lows:*] **described in this section.**

12 “[*(a)*] **(2)(a)** Grazing land within the district shall be protected by the
13 [*forester*] **State Forester** at a pro rata cost of **not less than 30 cents** per
14 acre for all grazing land within the district boundary. However, forest patrol
15 assessments levied and assessed under ORS 477.270 against such lands that
16 are not owned by public agencies, **including grazing land owned in fee**
17 **by a federally recognized Indian tribe in this state or by a member of**
18 **a federally recognized Indian tribe in this state,** may not exceed one-half
19 of the pro rata cost per acre[, *exclusive of any assessment per acre under ORS*
20 *477.880*].

21 **“(b)(A) Except as provided by subparagraph (B) of this paragraph,**
22 **the rates established by paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be ad-**
23 **justed annually for inflation since 2025 based on the Consumer Price**
24 **Index for All Urban Consumers, West Region (All Items), as published**
25 **by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of**
26 **Labor.**

27 **“(B) If the annual adjustment under this paragraph results in a rate**
28 **that is lower than the rate for the previous year, the rate shall remain**
29 **unchanged from the previous year.**

30 “[*(b)*] **(3)** Timberland within the district shall be protected by the

1 [forester] **State Forester** at a pro rata cost per acre for all timberland within
2 the district boundary. However, forest patrol assessments levied and assessed
3 under ORS 477.270 against [*such lands*] **timberland** that [*are*] **is** not owned
4 by public agencies, **including grazing land owned in fee by a federally**
5 **recognized Indian tribe in this state or by a member of a federally re-**
6 **cognized Indian tribe in this state**, may not exceed one-half of the pro rata
7 cost per acre[, *exclusive of any assessment per acre under ORS 477.880*].

8 “[(2)] (4) The cost of protection described in this section shall be in ac-
9 cordance with a budget for the district approved by the State Board of
10 Forestry.

11 **“SECTION 14.** ORS 477.270 is amended to read:

12 “477.270. (1) Subject to the forest patrol assessment limitations set forth
13 in ORS 477.230:

14 “(a) The budgeted cost of the forester, as provided for in ORS 477.205 to
15 477.281, in providing protection for privately owned forestland shall be a lien
16 upon such property, shall be reported by the forester to the governing body
17 of the county in which the lands are situated on or after July 1 of each fiscal
18 year, and shall be levied and collected by the governing body with the next
19 taxes on the land in the same manner and with the same interest, penalty
20 and cost charges as apply to ad valorem property taxes in this state. The
21 governing body shall instruct the proper officer to extend the amounts on the
22 assessment roll in a separate account, and the procedure provided by law for
23 the collection of taxes and delinquent taxes shall apply. Upon collection
24 thereof, the governing body shall repay the entire amount collected to the
25 forester.

26 “(b) In lieu of the procedures under paragraph (a) of this subsection, the
27 forester, under the direction of the State Board of Forestry, may make direct
28 billing of the budgeted cost to owners of forestland and receive payment of
29 the cost therefrom. In the event that under such billing procedures any
30 owners fail to make payment, the unpaid budgeted cost shall become a lien

1 against the property so billed and shall be levied and collected with the next
2 taxes on such property as described in paragraph (a) of this subsection.

3 “(c) The budgeted cost of the forester in providing protection for
4 forestland owned by the state or by a political subdivision shall be paid to
5 the forester on or before the first day of January of the fiscal year for which
6 such protection is to be provided.

7 “(2) Except as provided in ORS 477.230 [(2)] (4), all moneys received by
8 the forester pursuant to this section shall be paid into the State Treasury,
9 credited to the State Forestry Department Account and used exclusively for
10 the purposes of ORS 477.205 to 477.281.

11

12 **“MINIMUM ASSESSMENT AND SURCHARGE**

13

14 **“SECTION 15.** ORS 477.277 is amended to read:

15 “477.277. (1)(a) In addition to any other assessment prescribed by ORS
16 477.205 to 477.281, [*in any fiscal year in which the Emergency Fire Cost*
17 *Committee determines pursuant to ORS 477.760 that the unencumbered balance*
18 *of the Oregon Forest Land Protection Fund is less than \$22.5 million,]* a sur-
19 charge shall **annually** be levied and assessed in the amount of [~~\$47.50~~] **\$58**
20 for each improved lot or parcel[, *except as provided in ORS 477.760,*] to defray
21 the increased cost of fire suppression on forestland that is caused by the
22 existence of the improvements.

23 **“(b)(A) Except as provided in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph,**
24 **the surcharge established by paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be**
25 **adjusted annually for inflation since 2025 based on the Consumer Price**

16 ment unless approved in writing by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court;

17 “(c) Are not effective for agencies in the legislative department of gov-
18 ernment unless approved in writing by the President of the Senate and the
19 Speaker of the House of Representatives;

20 “(d) Shall be reported by the state agency to the Oregon Department of
21 Administrative Services within 10 days of their adoption; and

22 “(e) Are rescinded on adjournment sine die of the next regular session of
23 the Legislative Assembly as described in this subsection, unless otherwise
24 authorized by enabling legislation setting forth the approved fees.

25 “(2) This section does not apply to:

26 “(a) Any tuition or fees charged by a public university listed in ORS
27 352.002.

28 “(b) Taxes or other payments made or collected from employers for un-
29 employment insurance required by ORS chapter 657 or premium assessments
30 required by ORS 656.612 and 656.614 or contributions and assessments cal-

1 culated by cents per hour for workers' compensation coverage required by
2 ORS 656.506.

3 “(c) Fees or payments required for:

4 “(A) Health care services provided by the Oregon Health and Science
5 University, by the Oregon Veterans' Homes pursuant to ORS 408.362 and
6 408.365 to 408.385 and by other state agencies and institutions pursuant to
7 ORS 179.610 to 179.770.

8 “(B) Copayments and premiums paid to the Oregon medical assistance
9 program.

10 “(C) Assessments paid to the Department of Consumer and Business Ser-
11 vices under sections 3 and 5, chapter 538, Oregon Laws 2017.

12 “(d) Fees created or authorized by statute that have no established rate
13 or amount but are calculated for each separate instance for each fee payer
14 and are based on actual cost of services provided.

15 “(e) State agency charges on employees for benefits and services.

16 “(f) Any intergovernmental charges.

17 “(g) Forest protection district assessment rates established by ORS 477.210
18 to 477.265 [*and the Oregon Forest Land Protection Fund fees established by*
19 *ORS 477.760*].

20 “(h) State Department of Energy assessments required by ORS 456.595 and
21 469.421 (8).

22 “(i) Assessments on premiums charged by the Director of the Department
23 of Consumer and Business Services pursuant to ORS 731.804 or fees charged
24 by the director to banks, trusts and credit unions pursuant to ORS 706.530
25 and 723.114.

26 “(j) Public Utility Commission operating assessments required by ORS
27 756.310 or charges paid to the Residential Service Protection Fund required
28 by chapter 290, Oregon Laws 1987.

29 “(k) Fees charged by the Housing and Community Services Department
30 for intellectual property pursuant to ORS 456.562.

1 “(L) New or increased fees that are anticipated in the legislative budget-
2 ing process for an agency, revenues from which are included, explicitly or
3 implicitly, in the legislatively adopted budget or the legislatively approved
4 budget for the agency.

5 “(m) Tolls approved by the Oregon Transportation Commission pursuant
6 to ORS 383.004.

7 “(n) Portal provider fees as defined in ORS 276A.270 and established by
8 the State Chief Information Officer under ORS 276A.276 (3) and recommended
9 by the Electronic Government Portal Advisory Board.

10 “(o) Fees set by the State Parks and Recreation Director and approved
11 by the State Parks and Recreation Commission under ORS 390.124 (2)(b).

12 “(3)(a) Fees temporarily decreased for competitive or promotional reasons
13 or because of unexpected and temporary revenue surpluses may be increased
14 to not more than their prior level without compliance with subsection (1)
15 of this section if, at the time the fee is decreased, the state agency specifies
16 the following:

17 “(A) The reason for the fee decrease; and

18 “(B) The conditions under which the fee will be increased to not more
19 than its prior level.

20 “(b) Fees that are decreased for reasons other than those described in
21 paragraph (a) of this subsection may not be subsequently increased except
22 as allowed by ORS 291.050 to 291.060 and 294.160.

23

24 “**ACREAGE ASSESSMENT**

25

26 “**SECTION 30. ORS 477.880, 477.960 and 477.970 are repealed.**

27

28 “**ZONING OF CERTAIN LANDS**

29

30 “**SECTION 31. ORS 476.310, 476.320, 476.330, and 476.340 are repealed.**

1 **“SECTION 32. Lands that are classified under ORS 476.310 as zone**
2 **1 lands immediately prior to the effective date of this 2025 Act are**
3 **classified as Class 3 lands, as defined in ORS 526.324, unless and until**
4 **reclassified.**

5 **“SECTION 33. ORS 242.702 is amended to read:**

6 “242.702. As used in ORS 242.702 to 242.824, unless the context requires
7 otherwise:

8 “(1) ‘Appointing power’ includes every person or group of persons who,
9 acting singly or as a board, council or commission, are vested with authority
10 to select, appoint or employ any person to hold any position subject to civil
11 service under ORS 242.702 to 242.824.

12 “(2) ‘Appointment’ includes all means of selecting or employing any per-
13 son to hold any position subject to civil service under ORS 242.702 to 242.824.

14 “(3) ‘Civil service’ means the civil service system established under ORS
15 242.702 to 242.824.

16 “(4) ‘Commission’ means a civil service commission created under ORS
17 242.702 to 242.824.

18 “(5) ‘Commissioner’ means a member of the civil service commission cre-
19 ated under ORS 242.702 to 242.824.

20 “(6) ‘Employees’ means persons whose principal duties consist of pre-
21 venting or combating fire or preventing the loss of life or property from fire.

22 “(7) ‘Fire department’ means any organization maintained by any political
23 subdivision for the purpose of preventing or combating fire.

24 “(8) ‘Governing body’ means the council or city commissioners of a city,
25 the county court or board of county commissioners of a county, the board
26 of directors of a rural fire protection district[,] **and** the board of commis-
27 sioners of a domestic water supply corporation [*and the county court or board*
28 *of county commissioners acting under ORS 476.310 to 476.340 for the purposes*
29 *of preventing and controlling fire on zone 2 rural lands*].

30 “(9) ‘Political subdivision’ means any city, county, municipal corporation,

1 rural fire protection district[,] **or** domestic water supply corporation [*or or-*
2 *ganization authorized under ORS 476.310 to 476.340 to combat fire on zone 2*
3 *rural lands which employs four or more full-time firefighters, not including the*
4 *chief of the fire department*].

5 “(10) ‘Position’ includes any office, place or employment.

6
7 **“RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICTS**

8
9 **“SECTION 34.** ORS 478.010 is amended to read:

10 “478.010. (1) A rural fire protection district may be formed in the manner
11 set forth in ORS 478.010 to 478.100.

12 “(2) A district may not include:

13 “[*(a) Territory within a city unless otherwise authorized by law.*]

14 “[*(b)*] **(a)** Territory within a water supply district organized under ORS
15 chapter 264 if the district has previously been authorized by its electors to
16 exercise the fire protection powers prescribed by ORS 264.340.

17 “[*(c)*] **(b)** [*Forestlands*] **Forestland** included within a forest protection
18 district under ORS 477.205 to 477.281 unless the owner consents and notifies
19 the rural fire protection district[, *however, forestland protected pursuant to*
20 *ORS 477.205 to 477.281 and not exceeding five acres in one ownership shall*
21 *be included in the rural fire protection district without the owner’s consent if*
22 *the ownership includes any structures subject to damage by fire*], **except as**
23 **provided in subsection (3) of this section.** [*Forestland included in a rural*
24 *fire protection district under this subsection subjects the forestland to assess-*
25 *ments for fire protection by the rural fire protection district and the forest*
26 *protection district.*]

27 “[*(d)*] **(c)** Railroad rights of way or improvements thereon or rolling stock
28 moving thereover unless the owner of such property consents.

29 “[*(e)*] **(d)** Ocean shores as defined by ORS 390.605.

30 **“(3)(a) Notwithstanding subsection (2)(b) of this section, forestland**

1 protected pursuant to ORS 477.205 to 477.281 that is within the exterior
2 boundaries of an existing rural fire protection district shall be included
3 in the rural fire protection district without the owner’s consent.

4 “(b) Forestland described in paragraph (a) of this subsection is
5 subject to limitations on assessment as described in section 36 of this
6 2025 Act.

7 “(4) Forestland protected pursuant to ORS 477.205 to 477.281 that is
8 included in a rural fire protection district is subject to assessments for
9 fire protection by the rural fire protection district and the forest pro-
10 tection district.

11 “SECTION 35. The amendments to ORS 478.010 by section 34 of this
12 2025 Act apply to all rural fire protection districts, whether formed
13 before, on or after the effective date of this 2025 Act. Forestland de-
14 scribed in ORS 478.010 (3)(a), as amended by section 34 of this 2025 Act,
15 is made part of a rural fire protection district without the district’s
16 taking any action to include such forestland.

17 “SECTION 36. (1) As used in this section, ‘qualified forestland’
18 means forestland that is:

19 “(a) Included in a rural fire protection district under ORS 478.010
20 (3); and

21 “(b) Outside the limits of a city.

22 “(2) If a structure exists, in whole or in part, on qualified
23 forestland, the property subject to taxation by a rural fire protection
24 district shall include the value of any structures subject to taxation
25 and may not exceed 10 acres in any one ownership.

26 “(3) If a structure does not exist on qualified forestland, the prop-
27 erty subject to taxation by a rural fire protection district is limited to
28 individual lots or parcels not exceeding 10 acres in size and may not
29 include any lot or parcel exceeding 10 acres in size.

30 “SECTION 37. ORS 478.120 is amended to read:

1 “478.120. The authority to include forestland within a rural fire protection
2 district pursuant to ORS 478.010 [(2)(c)] **(2)(b)** applies to forestland within
3 the exterior boundaries of an existing district and to forestland on which
4 structures subject to damage by fire have been added after July 20, 1973.

5 **“SECTION 38.** ORS 478.140 is amended to read:

6 “478.140. Any owner consenting to add the forestland of the owner to the
7 district under ORS 478.010 [(2)(c)] **(2)(b)** shall do so on forms supplied by the
8 Department of Revenue. The owner shall file the original with the district.
9 The district shall forward a copy to the assessor of each county in which the
10 land is located, within 20 days of receipt.

11
12 **“TRANSFERS FROM MOBILIZATION FUND**

13
14 **“SECTION 39.** ORS 476.565 is amended to read:

15 “476.565. (1)(a) The State Fire Marshal Mobilization Fund is established
16 in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund.

17 “(b) The State Fire Marshal Mobilization Fund consists of moneys ap-
18 propriated by the Legislative Assembly for deposit in the fund, grant funds
19 received by the Department of the State Fire Marshal from the Federal
20 Emergency Management Agency, and other moneys appropriated, allocated,
21 deposited or transferred to the fund by the Legislative Assembly or other-
22 wise.

23 “(c) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the department
24 for:

25 **“(A) Eligible mobilization costs incurred by the department and re-**
26 **imbursements pursuant to ORS 476.560[.]; and**

27 **“(B) Transfers pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.**

28 **“(2) The department may transfer moneys from the fund to the**
29 **following funds as the department deems necessary to carry out its**
30 **duties:**

1 “(a) The State Fire Marshal Fund established under ORS 476.055;
2 **and**

3 “(b) The Community Risk Reduction Fund established under ORS
4 **476.396.**

5 “[(2)] (3) As used in this section, ‘eligible mobilization costs’ means ex-
6 penses incurred for emergency mobilization and pre-positioning activities in
7 Oregon.

8

9 **“TREASURY LOANS**

10

11 **“SECTION 40. (1) If the State Treasurer transfers moneys under**
12 **ORS 293.210 from funds having excess moneys to funds under the ad-**
13 **ministration of the State Forestry Department or the Department of**
14 **the State Fire Marshal during the biennium ending June 30, 2027, for**
15 **the purpose of enabling those agencies to pay for wildfire suppression**
16 **costs, the Legislative Assembly shall appropriate moneys or otherwise**
17 **make moneys available to the borrowing funds in an amount sufficient**
18 **to repay the lending funds.**

19 “(2) As used in this section, ‘borrowing fund’ and ‘lending fund’
20 **have the meanings given those terms in ORS 293.205.**

21

22 **“FIRE PROTECTION COST OFFSET**

23

24 **“SECTION 41. (1) In each biennium, the State Forestry Department**
25 **shall apply an offset against the annual costs of fire protection pro-**
26 **vided by the department for forestland that is:**

27 “(a) Classified as Class 3 under ORS 526.324; and

28 “(b) Located within a forest protection district.

29 “(2) The department shall apply the offset equally to each acre of
30 **forestland subject to the offset.**

1 **“SECTION 42. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
2 **ation, there is appropriated to the State Forestry Department, for the**
3 **biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount**
4 **of \$1,500,000 to carry out the provisions of section 41 of this 2025 Act.**

9 **only for the convenience of the reader and do not become part of the**
10 **statutory law of this state or express any legislative intent in the**
