**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1098**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 21, delete “(2)” and insert “(2)(a)”.

2 On page 2, after line 1, insert:

3 “(b) Nothing in paragraph (a) of this subsection requires a licensed
4 teacher with a library media endorsement, a district school board, an ad-
5 ministrator or any other person responsible for the selection or retention of
6 library materials in a school library or a classroom library to select or retain
7 library materials that are not grade-level appropriate.”.

8 Delete lines 7 through 10 and insert:

9 “(b) A committee from the school or school district considers the request
10 made under paragraph (a) of this subsection to ensure compliance with sub-
11 section (2) of this section;

12 “(c) If the committee described in paragraph (b) of this subsection agrees
13 to the removal, the committee:

14 “(A) Provides a public written explanation for the removal; and

15 “(B) If the reason for the removal was that the library materials were not
16 grade-level appropriate, provides to the Department of Education, upon re-
17 quest, a written explanation of the factors considered by the committee to
18 determine that the library materials were not grade-level appropriate; and”.

19 In line 11, delete “(c)” and insert “(d)”.

20 In line 12, delete “(b)” and insert “(c)”.

21 In line 31, delete “(2)” and insert “(2)(a)”.

1 After line 34, insert:

2 “(b) Nothing in paragraph (a) of this subsection requires the board to
3 adopt any textbooks or instructional materials that are not grade-level ap-
4 propriate.”.

5 On page 3, line 5, after the period insert “Nothing in this subsection re-
6 quires the selection of textbooks or instructional materials that are not
7 grade-level appropriate.”.

8 Delete lines 10 through 13 and insert:

9 “(b) A committee from the school district considers the request made un-
10 der paragraph (a) of this subsection to ensure compliance with subsection (1)
11 of this section;

12 “(c) If the committee described in paragraph (b) of this subsection agrees
13 to the removal, the committee:

14 “(A) Provides a public written explanation for the removal; and

15 “(B) If the reason for the removal was that the textbook or instructional
16 materials were not grade-level appropriate, provides to the Department of
17 Education, upon request, a written explanation of the factors considered by
18 the committee to determine that the textbook or instructional materials were
19 not grade-level appropriate; and”.

20 In line 14, delete “(c)” and insert “(d)”.

21 In line 15, delete “(b)” and insert “(c)”.

22 In line 32, delete “(2)” and insert “(2)(a)”.

23 After line 37, insert:

24 “(b) Nothing in paragraph (a) of this subsection requires a district school
25 board or a committee or administrator responsible for the adoption of text-
26 books or other instructional materials to adopt textbooks or other instruc-
27 tional materials that are not grade-level appropriate.”.

28 Delete lines 43 through 45.

29 On page 4, delete line 1 and insert:

30 “(b) A committee from the school district considers the request made un-

1 der paragraph (a) of this subsection to ensure compliance with subsection (2)
2 of this section;

3 “(c) If the committee described in paragraph (b) of this subsection agrees
4 to the removal, the committee:

5 “(A) Provides a public written explanation for the removal; and

6 “(B) If the reason for the removal was that the textbook or instructional
7 materials were not grade-level appropriate, provides to the Department of
8 Education, upon request, a written explanation of the factors considered by
9 the committee to determine that the textbook or instructional materials were
10 not grade-level appropriate; and”.

11 In line 2, delete “(c)” and insert “(d)”.

12 In line 3, delete “(b)” and insert “(c)”.

13 In line 15, delete “(3)” and insert “(3)(a)”.

14 After line 20, insert:

15 “(b) Nothing in paragraph (a) of this subsection requires a district school
16 board, an administrator or any person responsible for the development or
17 implementation of curriculum in a public elementary or secondary school in
18 Oregon from using program materials that are not grade-level appropriate.”.

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
