The bill also opens the door to innovative programs like safe parking programs and pod villages, which provide flexible and immediate solutions for individuals experiencing homelessness. Beaverton is proud to operate a safe parking program in coordination with local places of worship, providing an alternative to congregate shelters, but we are concerned about our ability to maintain funding due to the city's current general fund deficit.

Importantly, HB 3644 allocates full funding for the program as it exists today. This funding is essential for maintaining current services and support. However, it is crucial to view this as a minimum baseline. We encourage the legislature to consider this allocation as the foundation upon which the program can grow and expand in response to the evolving needs of our communities.

In conclusion, I urge you to support HB 3644 and its funding. This bill represents a significant step forward in addressing homelessness in Oregon. By providing a stable framework, future funding potential, and innovative program options, HB 3644 will help ensure that all Oregonians have access to safe and supportive housing.
