My name is Abby Knipp and I am a resident of North Bend, Oregon. I am a recreator, a scientist, and lover of the ocean. I dedicated years of research to studying climate change impacts in coastal ecosystems and I feel incredibly passionate about protecting marine and coastal environments. I now work for a non-profit on the south coast of Oregon, working to protect both the environment and people who are on the front lines of climate change. I frequently recreate in the estuary and find immense joy in paddling around, identifying cool inter-tidal organisms, and carefully walking out on the mud-flats during low tide. These coastal ecosystems are a true wonder and provide us humans with so many benefits - many that we cannot see, but they are working in our favor, such as eelgrass. But I also have first-hand experience seeing these ecosystems destroyed in other parts of the world and the subsequent impacts it had on local economies, social well-being, and overall environmental health. I fear for the future of our community due to the loss of this critical ecosystem.

I cannot stress enough how critical eelgrass is towards mitigating the impacts of climate change. But what I hope you take away, is how it also supports our economies and Coos County needs this plant to be protected in order for our community to thrive. This plant is a critical habitat for fish and crab, which support huge fisheries on the south coast of Oregon. I could not imagine what would happen to our community if the fisheries collapsed due to the loss of our fisheries habitat!. Eelgrass also supports our tourism economy - thousands of people come to recreate in the estuary and they want to see a thriving ecosystem. The loss of this plant means a loss of that ecosystem and the loss of an attractive tourism economy. Coos county is not a depressed community, but it will become one if we fail to secure funding to protect this vital ecosystem.
