

The Oregon Department of Human Services has an outstation at Oasis Health Center, I have served as a Family coach there since January of 2024. In that time, I have had the honor to work with 82 families, all have utilized one or more of the self sufficiency programs that are offered: Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, Employment Related Child Care, and Oregon Health Plan.

60% of those families are still engaging in services and support through services offered at the Self Sufficiency Outstation at Oasis.

40% of those families no longer need or have disengaged from services at the Self Sufficiency Outstation at Oasis.

3% no longer need Self Sufficiency Services and are Self Sufficient.

80% of the families that we are currently working with have not relapsed.

20% have relapsed.

30% mothers/families had their child placed by Child Welfare to Resource Care or Relative Care at the child's birth

75% of the mothers/families we have worked with had prior Child Welfare Involvement or a History of Child Welfare involvement in their life.

41% have current Child Welfare Involvement.

64% are Housed in permanent Housing.

12% are unhoused.

23% are in Temporary Housing.

Further Break Down of the Data around Emergency Lodging and those who have utilized it:

86% have moved on to being permanently housed.

13% have moved back to being unhoused.
