Thank you for the opportunity to submit a comment in support of SB 681.

Having lived in the Los Angeles, CA, area from the mid 40s to 1980, I am very familiar with the polluting effects of smog. Having lived in Medford, Oregon for almost 25 years now, I am well aware of the effects of poor air quality and smoke pollution from the wildfires, which began in this area around 2013/14.

With that background noted, curbing fossil fuel pollution is a critical issue with me. Thus, I am advocating that the Oregon State Treasury invest in sustainable resources that will both protect its financial portfolio and the planet from more fossil fuels contamination, that it not invest in predatory private investment firms, and that it not consider putting funds into companies that greenwash the environmental aspects of their activities.

The Treasury needs to invest in sustainable resources that will remain consistent and that will continue to support all of Oregon states's energy goals both short and long term.
