Thank you for the opportunity to comment in support of SB 681. My name is Sage Miller and I am a third year environmental science major at Willamette University and a North Salem resident.

Private investments in <u>fossil fuels are not a long-term reliable investment</u> especially for Oregonians. Since moving to Oregon I have already witnessed many of <u>my friends and neighbors suffer from the effects of climate change</u> including facing the extreme heat this past summer, and experiencing perpetual fear during the wildfire season. Oregon has the power to mitigate these events, but the majority of the time a lack of money and infrastructure has made <u>our community more vulnerable to climate change</u>.

As an environmental science major, I am very aware of the consequences that Oregonians face <u>if we do not start mitigating future climate extremes now</u>. I am also fearful of the economic impacts extreme weather events will have on my community. Our Treasury must choose sustainable investments that <u>protect the community and the planet</u>, not fossil fuels, not predatory private investment firms, and not companies that greenwash the environmental impact of their activities. Furthermore, it is vital that the Oregon State Treasury makes <u>investments that meet Oregon state energy goals</u> to protect its citizens.

To have the <u>most productive results</u> we need to reduce our carbon emissions by <u>targeting key contributors</u> and that includes ending more investment in the biggest carbon emitter! The Pause Act simply calls for <u>no NEW investments in the fossil fuel</u> industry for 5 years, which is a very short-term task, but it could do so much good! Investment in <u>Oregon's net zero plan is an investment in our future</u> and right now it is critical that we as a community and a state start making some positive change.
