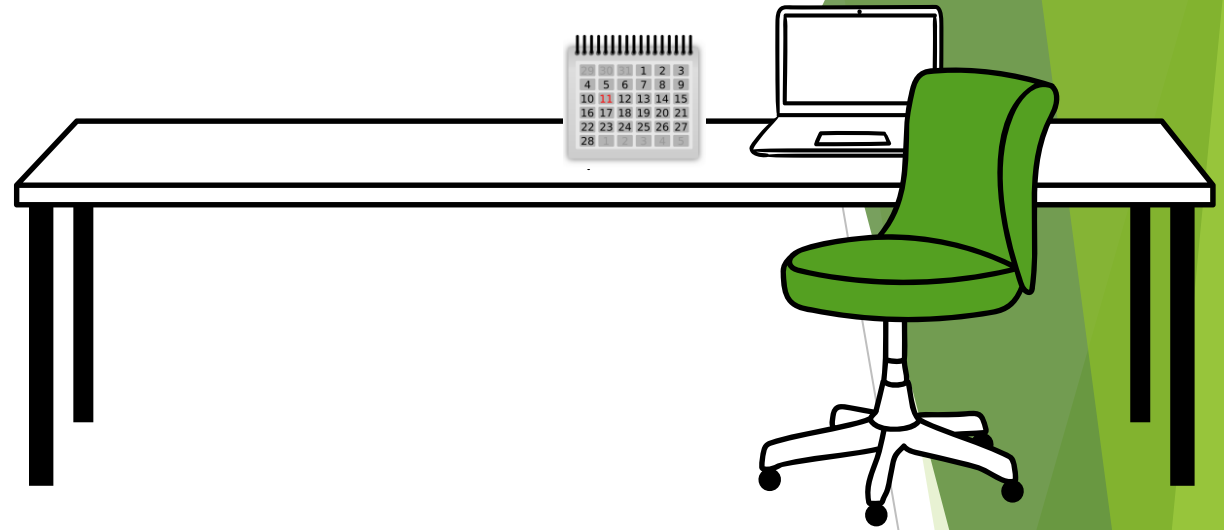


# Hope for Safe Spaces for Youth In Oregon

Punitive regulations (small things by statute must be investigated as either “abuse” or “neglect”)

# Facts:

There is only 1 program (with 2 locations, 1 child and 1 adolescent) for aggressive youth.

Acuity is on the rise

OHA estimated approximately 130 spots needed each year

Example: 24 and 55

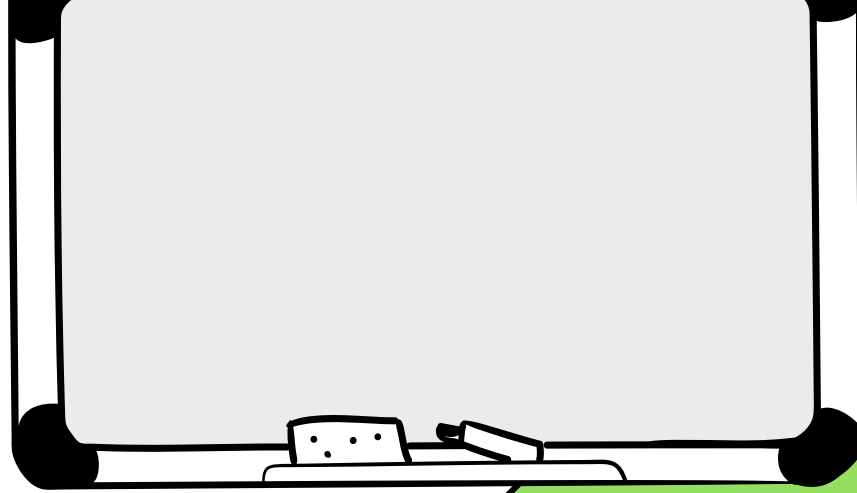
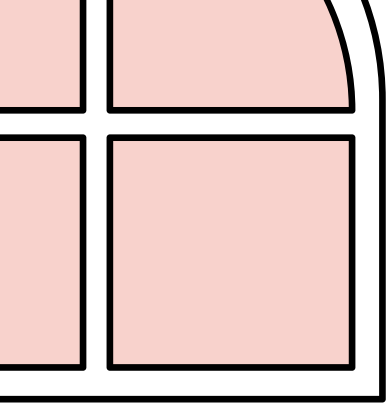


## Where Are These Youth:

- ✓ Emergency Rooms
- ✓ Hotels with 2-3 full time DHS caseworkers
- ✓ On the streets / homeless / incarceration
- ✓ In wrong level of care (pressuring foster system)

*"I wasn't safer when they rejected me. I was homeless, on the street..."*



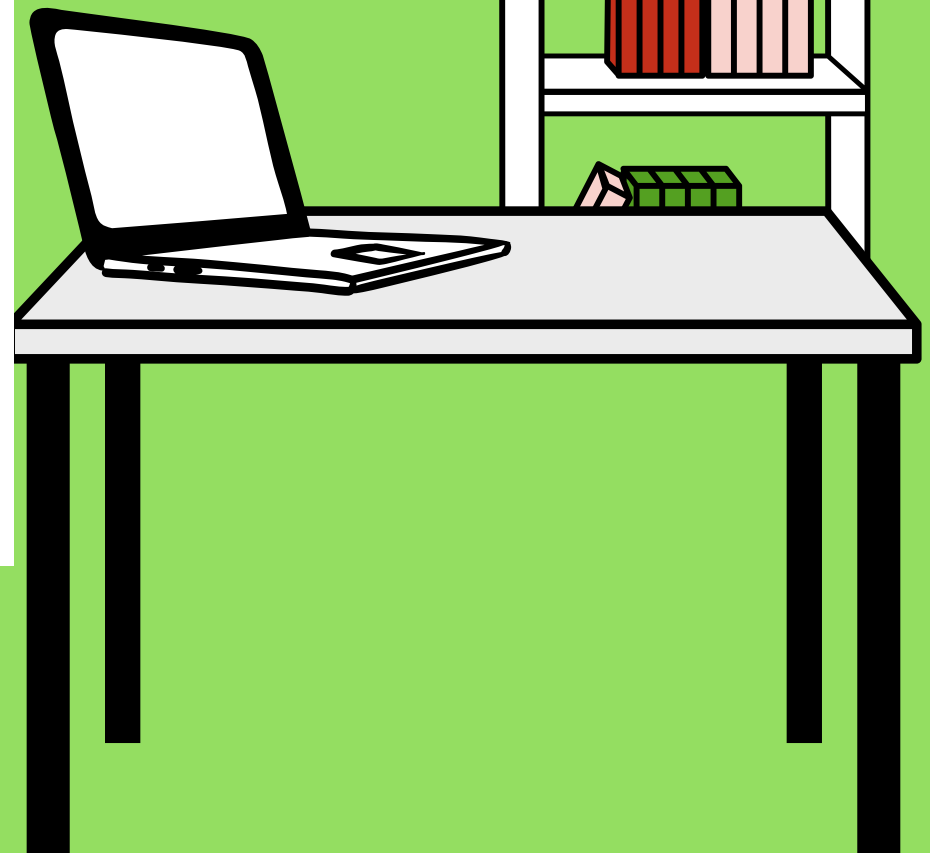


*To Be Safe, Kids Require
