The proposed changes in HB 3835 will help modernize these policies, ensuring they are both practical and effective. By integrating preventative and trauma-informed approaches, we can achieve better outcomes for children while also supporting the educators and professionals who care for them.

Clarity and consistency in policy are essential. HB 3835 will establish clear, fair, and uniform standards that protect all Oregon children, regardless of their educational or care setting. These improvements will have a significant and positive impact on both the workforce and the families who rely on these services.
