As a farmer, I appreciate having mandated Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) zones that limit industrial corporations or mass housing developments to freely come into an area and take over high valued soils that are needed to be kept for agricultural production that help feed the world. However, lately, the Energy Facility Siting Council has enabled large solar energy facilities to bypass these exclusion zones without the consideration of the current agricultural use zoning laws. Making the Energy Facility Siting Council follow the laws of all other entities wanting to place structures on EFU zoned land would allow the local governments to have a say on if these locations are appropriate.

I understand the need for more affordable energy, but not at the cost of permanently converting valuable farm ground. I encourage you to pass HB3422 and let the local governments have a much needed voice in the placement of these facilities.
