No one can point to any data that shows there are real problems with vote-by-mail. The so-called "problem" of voting fraud has been manufactured by those who know they won't win if the votes accurately represent all voices.

VBM is cost-effective, safe, and convenient, contributing to our high OR voter turnout. Twenty-five years of VBM in OR has never caused a result-altering problem: not even close.

In contrast, in-person elections are more costly, and actively disenfranchise voters who can't get time off, or can't travel, or can't stand in line in the rain to vote. By the standard of accurately representing the will of We The People, they are LESS ACCURATE than VBM.

Manufacturing a problem so you can sell the "solution" you want to see implemented is the real fraudulent behavior here. Don't let that happen.
