How much are we charging and what is the max we can charge under statute?

Fees are significantly less than those in our neighbor states. Currently, we charge \$20 a year with a maximum of all licenses at \$30 per year by statute.

Provide a tiered system to allow for different classes of licenses like California and Washington. These fees will be from \$25.00 to \$125.00 annually. Maximum annual licensing fee will be set in statute at \$150.

Additional fees for online wagering

• Increase the Online Wagering daily fees by \$25.00 (25%).

Currently we increase fees automatically on handle at 2.5% per year and we charge a daily licensing fee of \$200.00.
