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Teaching is a selfless profession we're always working all hours of the day and weekends our classrooms are full of kids all the time. From all sorts of families demographics financial means good and bad ugly and beautiful. I know that class sizes are way too large every time you have more than 22 children in the classroom you know you have too many and I've never had less than 30 in the 11 years I've been teaching in Oregon sometimes 36 at a time sometimes more students than chairs and tables. My budget is tiny I teach art and I have an average of 9 cents per student per day so I can afford to buy each student a drawing pen and a SketchBook. And that's it I have to write grants to fund the rest of my classes I have to go to garage sales I have to ask people for more money. My own kids have their own problems with school being it not challenging enough being that they have dyslexia and no one strained and dyslexia special ed never has enough people in special Ed the longer you're in education the more you realize it doesn't work that well and if you're an outsider you don't realize that because you're not there you can't make decisions about things you don't know about so it's good to listen to people who are on the ground doing the job working everyday cuz they actually know what the day today is and that's the most important thing to make decisions
