

House Bill 3992

Sponsored by Representative FAHEY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act makes budget changes for certain state agencies. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.1).

Modifies an appropriation from the General Fund to the Emergency Board.

Modifies limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies.

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to specified state agencies for specified biennial expenses.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section 1, chapter 628, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, for the purposes for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds, is decreased by \$800,000.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (12), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, collected or received by the Department of Transportation, for finance and budget, is increased by \$2,429,666, for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled House Bill 3991).

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (11), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, collected or received by the Department of Transportation, for Department of Transportation administrative services, is increased by \$1,150,063, for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled House Bill 3991).

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (8), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimburse-

1 ment from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and
2 federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, collected or received
3 by the Department of Transportation, for commerce and compliance, is increased by
4 \$3,746,382, for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled
5 House Bill 3991).

6 **SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
7 expenditures established by section 2 (10), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium
8 ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
9 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimburse-
10 ment from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and
11 federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, collected or received
12 by the Department of Transportation, for public transportation, is increased by \$196,600,000,
13 for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled House Bill
14 3991).

15 **SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
16 expenditures established by section 2 (9), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium
17 ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
18 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimburse-
19 ment from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and
20 federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, collected or received
21 by the Department of Transportation, for policy, data and analysis, is increased by \$252,725,
22 for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled House Bill
23 3991).

24 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
25 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium
26 ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
27 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimburse-
28 ment from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and
29 federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2025, collected or received
30 by the Department of Transportation, for project delivery and support, is increased by
31 \$191,889, for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled
32 House Bill 3991).

33 **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
34 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2025, for the biennium
35 ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
36 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
37 funds, collected or received by the Secretary of State, for the Audits Division, is increased
38 by \$479,446, for implementation of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled
39 House Bill 3991).

40 **SECTION 9.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-
41 ated to the Legislative Policy and Research Committee, for the biennium ending June 30,
42 2027, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$300,000, for implementation of chapter __,
43 Oregon Laws 2025 (special session) (Enrolled House Bill 3991).

44 **SECTION 10.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
45 priated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium ending June

1 30, 2027, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$500,000, to undertake a review of the
2 methodology for the highway cost allocation study as required by chapter __, Oregon Laws
3 2025 (special session) (Enrolled House Bill 3991).

4 SECTION 11. This 2025 special session Act being necessary for the immediate preserva-
5 tion of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025
6 special session Act takes effect on its passage.
