As a father of three school-aged children in Oregon, I strongly oppose HB 3992 because it prioritizes bloated bureaucratic spending on transportation audits and programs over the urgent needs of our public education system, all while setting the stage for inevitable tax increases that will hit hardworking families like mine the hardest.
