Work Session

SB 588

Provides that post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a police officer or firefighter is an injury or disease sustained in the actual performance of duties for purposes of benefits under the Public Employees Retirement System in certain circumstances.

SB 871

Requires Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission retail licensees to maintain invoices of alcoholic beverage deliveries.

SB 916

Provides that an individual otherwise eligible for unemployment insurance benefits is not disqualified for any week that the individual's unemployment is due to a labor dispute in active progress at the individual's place of employment.

Public Hearing

SB 705

Provides an alternative weekly minimum amount of workers' compensation benefits for temporary total disability.

SB 847

Changes the calculation of the Retirement Health Insurance Account subsidy under the Public Employees Retirement System.

SB 906

Requires that itemized statements provided to employees show, in plain language, the amount and purpose of each deduction.
