Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB3075

As a concerned Oregonian, I oppose HB3075 because it lacks a fiscal impact statement, leaving taxpayers in the dark about its true cost. Further, this bill, amending firearm permit rules from Ballot Measure 114, doubles permit fees and extends processing times from 30 to 60 days, burdening law-abiding citizens while likely increasing demands on the Oregon State Police all the while not addressing root causes of increasing violence noted in our communities. Without a clear fiscal analysis, we're left to guess the price tag of this expanded bureaucracy—higher administrative costs, more staff time, and no evidence these changes will enhance safety. Responsible legislation demands transparency & adherence to both the State and Federal Constitution.
